General Rules of the Show

1. The Southern Minnesota Youth Dairy Show will be held 9:30 am Saturday, June 19, 2010 at the Brown County Fairgrounds in New Ulm, Minnesota. Information can be obtained by contacting Co-Chair Paul Fritsche at (507) 359-7766 or email pfitsche@newulmtnet.net. This is an open style youth show and is open to anyone between the ages of 7 and 21 years of age who have made proper entries.

2. The Purebred Dairy Cattle Association (PDCA) Code of Ethics shall be in force for this show and shall include all rules, age classifications and group class definitions. Exhibitors found to be in violation, including any and all persons who shall assist the exhibitor with the fitting, care and show preparation of the animals and entry forms, shall face penalties deemed appropriate by the PDCA and/or the Southern Minnesota Youth Dairy Show Committee. These penalties could include but not limited to being banned from the show. A copy of the Code of Conduct is available from the PDCA by emailing pdca@wdexpo.com.

3. The Southern Minnesota Youth Dairy Show, Committee members, the Brown County Fair Board nor any show volunteers shall not be held responsible for lost, neither stolen or damaged property nor any accidents.

4. All SMYDS exhibitors and parents and/or legal guardian are solely responsible for reading and understanding all rules, regulations and information of the SMYDS. Signing of the official entry forms by the exhibitor, and the parent and/or legal guardian if the exhibitor is under the age of 18, constitutes an agreement and warranty of the entrant that he/she has read and fully understands and accepts all rules and regulations of the SMYDS including without limitation the PDCA Show Ring Code of Ethics and will comply with them.

5. All entries are due to the show committee at the designated address on the entry blank by *June 7, 2010*. An entry fee of \$2.00 per head will be charged. Late entries will be accepted but will be charged an entry fee of \$5.00 per head in order to show. Official post office cancellation date will be used as the date of entry. *All fees must accompany the entry blank. Electronic entries (faxes or emails) will not be accepted. Use 1 form (all pages) per exhibitor. DO NOT USE EITHER SIDE FOR MORE THAN 1 EXHIBITOR OR ENTRY WILL BE VOIDED. We can not properly catalog entries when this is not followed.*

6. All exhibitors must be between the ages of 7 & 21 years old. Ages shall be the age of the exhibitor the day of the show. All exhibitors must show their own entries unless a substitute leadsman has been approved by the show committee. All substitute leadsman must meet the age requirements of the show (MGBA Jr. Show rules may apply). Adults will only be allowed to assist with group classes and championship line-ups (when the exhibitor has more than one animal involved) at the approval of the SMYDS show management. *No assistance will be allowed for Showmanship Classes.*

7. Each exhibitor will be limited to the number of entries they may make with the following totals:

16 animals total across all breed divisions (1 per classes 1-17)

1 entry per group class for each breed division (classes 18-20)

8. Exhibitors are responsible for supplying their own bedding, feed, and equipment. **NO BEDDING, FEED, SUPPLIES, OR EQUIPMENT** will be provided by show management or show facilities.

9. Milking facilities will be available with all milk going through the Brown Co. Fairgrounds milk house being donated to the SMYDS General Fund. Milking facilities and milk house will be managed by the SMYDS Volunteer Committee and opened at their discretion. Use of the milking facilities will be at your own risk, including but not limited to the animal(s) and people using the facility. *An SMYDS Milking Slip must be complete, signed, and turned in before you can use the facilities.* Please ask at check in for a slip.

10. NO LIVESTOCK WILL BE ALLOWED IN FOR STALLING UNTIL THE DESIGNATED TIME PENDING ARRIVAL OF A SHOW OFFICAL TO COMMENCE STALLING. Neither hay, nor straw, nor feed nor equipment

will be allowed in prior to that time. **ANIMALS MUST ACCOMPANY BEDDING!** Violators will be subject to the authoritative action of the Show Committee or Committee designee. Stalling will commence at approximately Noon on Friday, June 18th and end at 8:30 am on Saturday, June 19, 2010. **AGAIN WE STRESS THAT NO ONE WILL BE STALLED UNTIL SHOW PERSONAL ARE ON SITE AND FACILITIES ARE READY.** Exhibitors are encouraged to check-in and ID their animals on Friday to facilitate the show starting on time Saturday.

11. All stalling shall be on an assigned basis and will be directed by the Show Committee's designated representative. (Do to the increased number of animals entered the past few shows SMYDS management will be implementing a stalling chart to comfortably fit in all exhibitors and their animals.)

12. No livestock shall be removed until all judging is completed and all awards have been presented. Only permission by the show committee chairman or official veterinarian shall supercede this rule. Violators shall be penalized by, but not limited to, the forfeiture of all premiums, awards and placings. Judging completion will be the end of the Senior Showmanship class.

13. Current Minnesota Board of Animal Health regulations shall apply. All cattle shall be inspected by the official veterinarian the opening day of the show. The official veterinarian will order the immediate removal from the exhibition premises of any cattle with symptoms of infectious or communicable diseases. **This includes cattle with warts or ringworm. Health Certificates will be required for all animals exhibited and must list herd of origin** (including NAIS Premise ID) and complete individual identification for each animal listed. Health papers will be collected by SMYDS Volunteer Committee staff prior to stalling and will not be returned! Please ask us to photocopy if you need for transport puposes.

A. **Cattle from Minnesota: A health certificate will be required.** The paper shall state the herd of origin, including NAIS Premise ID Number, and listing the So. MN Youth Dairy Show as the consignee and the Brown County Fairgrounds as the destination. *Minnesota cattle originating from the Bovine TB Modified Accredited Advance (MAA) area will not be required to test for TB* but must be certified by their veterinary as coming from a herd free of any infectious or communicable disease including warts and ringworm. Cattle known by the exhibitor to have an infectious or communicable disease or to have been exposed to an infectious, communicable disease or to be from a quarantined herd may not be entered in an exhibition. Warts or ringworm are considered communicable diseases. Therefore cattle affected by these diseases cannot be exhibited. A statement from a veterinarian that an animal is being treated for these diseases is not acceptable

B. **Cattle originating from Minnesota from within the Bovine TB Modified Accredited (MA) area (at this time NW MN) will be required to have followed all regulations for movement from the surveillance area including the proper whole herd negative TB tests, a negative individual animal TB test within 60 days of the exhibition and the proper movement permits.** Dates and results of all testing including the last negative whole herd test shall be listed on the health certificate and a copy of the whole herd test shall be attached.

C. **Cattle from states other than Minnesota.** All animals must meet the Minnesota Importation requirements in addition to the above requirements. Health certificates must list the Southern Minnesota Youth Show as the consignee, Brown County Fairgrounds as the destination, and will be accepted if all necessary examinations and tests are conducted within 60 days prior to the show. The health certificated must be turned into a show official at the time of stalling. *Due to the current Federal Status for TB in the state of Minnesota, we suggested that out of state exhibitors contact their state Board of Animal Health to determine what health requirements are necessary to return from Minnesota after this exhibition.*

14. Check-in begins at stalling time on June 26, 2010 and ends at 8:30 am prior to the show. All entries must be verified, all fees paid and all animals ID'd and health checks completed by that time to be eligible to show. **Entries will be closed at that time and stalling will end!** *No further entries or substitutions, including group classes will be allowed after that time.*

15. In accordance with PDCA guidelines for show ring attire, the SMYDS encourages the use of white pants and/or skirts along with an appropriate shirt for this show. NO FARM advertising naming the exhibitor, farm or herd allowed on any attire in the ring (e.g. shirts, hats, jackets....ect.) 4-H, FFA and breed association shirts will be allowed.

16. Individual numbers cards will be used for each entry (animal or groups) and thus the use of a show harness is highly encouraged. Harnesses can be purchased through NASCO. NASCO can be contacted by phone at 1-800-558-9595 or online at www.eNASCO.com to place an order.

17. **Leases/ Exhibitor/Breeder definitions & regulations:**

Leases- Leases will be accepted if they meet the following requirements. All lease agreements must list the specific animal(s) that are to be shown by the lessee. Animal(s) must be identified by name, tag/tattoo, and/or a registration number if a registered animal. Grade animals must include a specific ID such as a unique tag/tattoo (eg, NAIS no. tag/ Vacc. Tag/ tattoo) on the lease agreement that can be used to identify the specific animal to the lease and entry form. Include name and address of both lessee and lesser, conditions of the lease agreement, and be signed and dated by both parties (include parent or guardian if either party is under 18 years). 4-H, FFA, or Breed Association lease forms will be accepted IF THEY SPECIFICALLY IDENTIFY THE ANIMAL(S) TO BE SHOWN and meet our required signature conditions. Leased animals shall not be considered for any bred and owned awards and may not be used in any bred and owned group classes at this show.

Exhibitor- For the purposes of this show the term exhibitor shall be defined as the actual owner, immediate family member (as defined in breeder) of an owner, or lessee (as defined in leases) of the animal at the time of the show. Only a single youth can be listed on the entry blank as the exhibitor of the animal/group entered. **NO MULTIPLE OWNERSHIPS ALLOWED.** Ownership must be listed on the registration paper in the name of the exhibitor, or a family member/partnership or a signed lease agreement that is accompanied by the registration paper for the registered show.

For the grade show ownership must be proven via family records such as DHIA, FFA SAE agreement, 4-H Affidavit, or the exhibitor must be willing to provide an affidavit stating such signed by a parent/guardian and the legal herd owner listing all animals with the proper unique individual animal ID to be exhibited if requested by the show officials. For grade entries we must be able to match up the individual animals listed on the herd record and/or lease to verify that the animal(s) entered is part of the herd (family or lessors) and the animal(s) entered on the entry form. Lessees should bring a copy of the lease agreement for verification. **See Leases for specific requirements for leased animals and lease papers.**

Breeder- For the purpose of this show, to be considered as the breeder, the exhibitor and/or his/her immediate family (grandparent, parent, guardian, brother or sister) must have owned the dam of the animal at the time of breeding and operate/house the herd as one breeding establishment including 1 milk permit and/or DHIA herd code. Animals bought “in dam” or purchased as embryos or from family members who operate under separate milk permits and/or DHIA herd code do not qualify as bred and owned.

Exhibitors who are leasing animals (such as 4-H and/or FFA members but not excluding other programs) are not the owner of the animal at time of breeding and so shall not qualify as the breeder of the animal as defined above.

18. The show will begin promptly at 9:30 am. Show order will be as follows:

Awards, premiums and placings will be forfeited if the animals are removed prior to the completion of the Senior Showmanship class unless approved by the Show Chairman or the official veterinarian. (see General Rules of the Show #12)

SMYDS Dairy Cattle Show Rules

The General Rules of the Southern Minnesota Youth Dairy Show shall apply to the Dairy Cattle Show for 2010. The following rules are specific to the Youth Dairy Cattle Show show only.

Rules of the Dairy Cattle Division:

1. This is a "Production Recognized Youth Show" that is opened to all youth between the ages of 7 & 21 years old. All ages will be decided as the age the day of the show.
2. The following breeds will be accepted:
Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, Milking Shorthorn, and Red & White Dairy Cattle.
3. Both registered and grades will be accepted in all breeds and will show as separate breed divisions.
 - A. Registry requirements will be as follows for each breed:

Ayrshire: Must be registered in the Ayrshire herd book. GR animals will be considered as registered for the purposes of this show

Brown Swiss: Must be in the herd book with full registration status. Step III Identity Enrollment (IE) animals and Step III Certified Identity Enrolled (CIE) animals may also show as registered.

Guernsey: Must be recorded in the Guernsey herd book as registered. GR animals will also be considered as registered for the purposes of this show.

Holstein: Must be registered in the Holstein USA herd book and listed as 87% or over purebred.

Jersey: Must be recorded in the Jersey herd book as registered. GR animals will also be considered as registered for the purposes of this show.

Milking Shorthorn: Must have full herd book 6 digit registry certificates. Tattoo must correspond with the registry certificate. Any animal that has any black hair cannot be shown as a Registered Milking Shorthorn.

Red & White: Must be registered in the Red & White Dairy Cattle Association herd book, and must be true Red & White in color (no black-red and/or brindle).

Any animal that qualifies for any of the above breed registration stipulations must enter and show as a registered animal. Original registration papers must be presented to show officials.

- B. Grade definition for each breed will consist of any animal not duly recorded in any herd book registry plus the following additional animals:

Ayrshire: Animals with papers listing them as OA or PR animals will show as grades.

Brown Swiss: Any Identity Enrolled animal that does not meet the final stage requirements as listed above.

Guernsey: Animals with papers listing them as PR and GT animals will show as grades.

Holsteins: Any Black and White animal or ID'd Holstein paper that lists the animal as 86% or less pure Holstein. Any Red and White animal showing Holstein characteristics but holding no breed registry papers may choose to show as a grade Holstein.

Jersey: Animals with papers listing them as OA or PR animals will show as grades.

Milking Shorthorn: Any Shorthorn type animal that has black hair and/or does not meet the registration requirements will show as a grade.

Red & White: Any animal true Red & White in color (no black-red and/or brindles) that carries no other registry paper for any breed association may choose to show as a grade Red & White.

4. Dual registered animals may show in only one breed division and must pre-enter in that division unless otherwise placed by show officials on show day upon examination of animal and papers. Grade animals must also choose to show in only one grade breed classification and must pre-enter in that classification.

5. A limited number of entries will be allowed per exhibitor.

- A. Each exhibitor may enter a total of 16 animals. This total shall include all entries made in all breed divisions (grade and/or registered). The exception is Novice Calf exhibitors who are limited to the Novice Calf Class and participation in the Junior Showmanship class.
- B. Each exhibitor will be limited to 1 entry per class entered (classes 1-17) and 1 entry per group class (classes 18-20) in each breed division
- C. No more than 3 calves may be entered per breed division (grade and/or registered).
- D. An animal may be shown in only one (1) class and by a single exhibitor.
- E. Animals used in group classes must have been entered and shown in the individual classes (classes 1-17) by that exhibitor
- F. Substitutions will be allowed within breed division (e.g. Reg. Holstein Sr. Calf for a Reg. Holstein Aged Cow).

6. Production Awards:

As a "Production Recognized Show" we will be presenting production awards as part of the milking classes beginning with the Junior 2 yr. olds.

- A. The top 305 day (or less if completed) actual records for Milk, Fat, and Protein will be recognized with awards in each milking class.
- B. To be eligible the 305 day record (or less if completed) must be filled out on the class entry for that individual animal. **A photocopy** of the individual animal's lactation page showing the actual 305 day record must be included with your entry. This sheet must be the complete copy and an official report generated and printed by a certified Milk Recording program's DRPC (i.e. Dairy Herd Improvement Assn or other Quality Certification Services - QCS certified testing program). Examples of what we will accept are the MN DHIA "Cow Page", lactation report showing the record at 305 days or less (and marked completed) or a breed DHIR report. We will not accept any on farm computer generated reports (i.e. Scout, Dairy Comp 305, PC Dart...etc). If the report does not include the completed record (such as an incomplete 305day record) then include a copy of the report showing the completed record for verification.
- C. Records must have been completed prior to May 1st of the current year and be deemed useable by USDA for the genetic evaluation program.
- D. Each animal must be placed in its respective class to be eligible for production awards.
- E. Any record, which cannot be validated, or animal that has not been placed in its proper show class, will not be eligible for production awards.
- F. Records that will be printed in the show catalog for publicity purposes are as follows:
 - 305 day or less record that are marked as completed or listed as RIP (Record in Progress)
 - 365 day record if accompanied by the 305 day record.

Individuals:

Class 1. Novice Calf Class * Calves born after January 1, 2010 but before April 30, 2010.

*Novice class shall consist of exhibitors under the age of 10 years old. Novice exhibitors are eligible only for this class and the Junior Showmanship class. All breeds, grade and registered, will show together unless there are 10 or more entries. If there are 10 or more entries then the class shall be split according to the discretion of the show committee

2. Spring Heifer Calf, born after March 1, 2010 and over 2 months old (*March and April calves only*)
3. Winter Heifer Calf, born between December 1, 2009 and February 29, 2010
4. Fall Heifer Calf, born between September 1, 2009 and November 30, 2009
5. Summer Yearling Heifer, born between June 1, 2009 and August 31, 2009
6. Spring Yearling Heifer, born between March 1, 2009 and May 31, 2009
7. Winter Yearling Heifer, born between December 1, 2008 and February 28, 2009
8. Fall Yearling Heifer (unfreshened) **, born between September 1, 2008 and Nov.30, 2008
9. Dry Cow 4 years and under, born September 1, 2005 and after* Production Class
10. Dry Cow 5 years and over, born before September 1, 2005 * Production Class
11. Junior 2 year old cow **, born between March 1, 2008 and August 31, 2008 *Production Class
12. Senior 2 year old cow, born between September 1, 2007and February 28, 2008 *Production Class
13. Junior 3 year old cow, born between March 1, 2007 and August 31, 2007 * Production Class
14. Senior 3 year old cow, born between September 1, 2006 and February 28, 2007* Production Class
15. 4 Year old Cow, born between September 1, 2005 and August 31, 2006 * Production Class
16. 5 year old cow, born between September 1, 2004 and August 31, 2005* Production Class
17. 6 years old cow and over, born before September 1, 2004 *Production Class

** All yearlings in milk will show as Junior 2 year olds. Any unfreshened 2 year old shall show in the proper 2 year old class for its birthdate.

Groups: Like individual entries, group entries are per breed division/therefore must be comprised of all the same breed division animals, example Registered Holsteins. You may make entries in each breed division.

Class 18. Junior Best 3 Females: Three females, all under two years of age, none of which have freshened. All Bred and Owned by the exhibitor.

19. Best 3 Females: Three females, any age, must be bred and owned by the exhibitor.

20. Produce of Dam: Two animals, any age, produce (off-spring) of one cow. Dam must be named on entry blank.

Champion Classes (Do not make entries in these classes):

Class 21. Breed Junior Champion and Breed Reserve Junior Champion (*selected from classes 2-8*)

22. Breed Senior Champion and Breed Reserve Senior Champion (*selected from classes 9-17*)

23. Breed Grand Champion and Breed Reserve Grand Champion (*selected from class 21 & 22*)

24. Breed Best Uddered of Breed Show (*to be selected from those selected in each milking class of each breed by the judge*)

Supreme Champion Division (Do not make entries in these classes):

OVR Class 25. Supreme Champ. Reg. of Show and Res. Sup. Champ. Reg. of Show

(*Shall be selected from the Individual Breed Grand and Reserve Grand Champions*)

OVR Class 26. Supreme Champion Grade of Show and Reserve Supreme Champ. Grade of Show

(*Shall be selected from the Individual Breed Grand and Reserve Grand Champions*)

OVR Class 27. Supreme Registered Best Uddered of Show

(*To be selected from the Best Uddered of each breed*)

OVR Class 28. Supreme Grade Best Uddered of Show
(To be selected from the Best Uddered of each breed)

8. Showmanship Division:

Three (3) showmanship classes will be offered that day for the Dairy Cattle Show. Advance entry will not be necessary. Champion and Reserve Champion awards will be presented in each class. Exhibitors may not have assistance for any of the showmanship classes while showing.

Show Class 29 Junior Showmanship (ages 7-10)

Show Class 30 Intermediate Showmanship (ages 11-14)

Show Class 31 Senior Showmanship (ages 15-21)

9. This will be an open style youth show with classes being placed and ribbons for 1st through 5th place will be given in classes 1-20. Premiums will be as follows:

1st Place \$5.00

Appropriate awards will be given in classes 21-31.
