


From the Minnesota Holstein Office

Chelsy is Minnesota's 2019 Brood Cow

 ${f P}$ ine-Shelter Chelsy Sho-ET is the winner of the 2019 Minnesota Brood Cow Contest. Chelsy was owned by the Alberts family near Pine Island, Minn.

Chelsy is a shottle daughter from the famous Pine Shelter Cheyenne-ET EX-95 DOM. Cheyenne was the Grand Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion at World Dairy Expo in 2003. Chelsy had an unfortunate accident at four-years old and had to be put down. However, she has left a lasting impact.

One of her best-known daughters is Pine-Shelter Carlia Wood-

PINE-SHELTER CHELSY SHO-ET VG-86

ET EX-94 2E. She had two records over 40,000 lbs Milk and has over 190,000 Lifetime Milk record. She is continuing to add to this record. In the show ring, Carlia was the first place 150,000 lb cow at the 2017 Midwest Fall National. That same year at the Minnesota State Holstein Show she took first in the 150,000

lb Cow class and was named best Bred and Owned of the show. Another influential Chelsy daughter is Pine-Shelter Claire Wood-ET. She was sold on the 2010 National Holstein Convention Sale as an embryo. Pine-Shelter Claire Wood-ET is the Granddam of the bull 94HO17998 Mayerick Crush.

Chelsy has 29 additional daughters. Ten are sired by Wood with an average score of 86. Four are sired by Boss Iron with an average score of 84.7. She has other daughters sired by Observer, Pontiac, Sanchez and more. The average score of all of her daughters is 84.1.

Chelsy's most notable son is 1HO10473 Pine Shelter Clay Wood

who is marketed by Genex. He is the sire of the Reserve Grand Champion, Honorable Mention Grand Champion, and Champion Bred and Owned at the 2018 Midwest National. Another one of her sons 7HO10998 Pine-Shelter Cesar San-ET has been marketed in the past by Select Sires.

Holstein History: First Things First By John Busacker

ne of my favorite people in the Holstein industry was the late Virgil Belter of Glencoe. Virgil had a cow that was a leader in many ways. In November of 1956, Virgil purchased Lind Jess Grande at the David Lind dispersal in Hamburg, Minn. Grande was Virgil's first registered Holstein. In 1959, Grande was All-State Three-Year Old —Virgil's first All-State winner. Grande became Virgil's first Excellent Cow, first 2-E cow, first cow over 200,000 lbs of milk lifetime and stood in the first stall in Virgil's barn. Her son, Belter Admiral Grant was All-State Jr. Yearling Bull in 1966—Virgil's first home-bred All-State winner. Later, he was sold to MN Valley Breeders in New Prague, the first Belter bull to enter AI service.

Grande's daughter Belter Ivanhoe Gay was Virgil's first homebred cow. Gay's daughter, Belter Centurion Gina was the Grand Champion of the State FFA Show in 1972, the first Belter Holstein to win Grand Champion at the MN State Fair. Getting back to 1959, one of Virgil's favorite and proudest moments in the showring was showing Grande in open class at the Minnesota State Fair. Allen Hetts, a popular judge from Fort Atkinson, Wis. praised her as a real dairy cow with a silky udder-- and placed her third-- it was one of the very first times she wasn't first.

ver since she was old enough to cross the road, Laura Alberts **C**Schimek has spent most of her days with the Holsteins at Pine Shelter Farms.

The farm is located near Pine Island, Minn., and is owned and operated by Laura's father, Dave and his two brothers Duane, and Rick Alberts. Laura (who focuses on the cows and youngstock) and her brother Eric (who focuses on the equipment and crops) are the sixth generation working on the farm.

"I did post-secondary classes at Rochester Community college during high school. Then I attended WITC in New Richmond," Laura said. "After that, I was lucky to spend some time working on several different sale crews and traveling places such as the Canadian Royal, California State Fair, Oregon, Kentucky, and Ohio. It was a great opportunity to travel and meet a lot of people, but in 1998 the farm offered me a house and a salary and it was time for me to come home full-time."

Although she was young when the farm first expanded in the late seventies, she can still remember playing in empty pits and watching some of the construction progress. Today, they milk about 600 Registered Holsteins between two sites. A majority of the cows are milked in a double-9 herringbone parlor that was built in 1979. A small group of cows is milked in the original tie stall barn where Laura lives today. In addition, the family farms over 1200 acres of forages to feed the herd and owns about 400 acres of pasture and woods.

Through juggling the roles of being a mother and handling the ups and downs of working in the dairy industry, Laura feels blessed to spend her days at Pine Shelter Farms.

Finding Purpose in Every Day

"I have been my dad's right-hand man working with the cows forever and we have lots of good times together," Laura said.

As an adult, not much has changed. Rather than running across the road to play on the farm, she wakes up early and drives the short distance from the "home" farm where she lives and to the main farm. She is still her dad's right-hand man as they work together on the day-to-day tasks of managing the herd.

However, now when she is filling in on an occasional parlor shift, she no longer needs to push a five gallon bucket around to stand on as she did in her childhood. Her days are fast-paced and focused on accomplishing as much as she can before her two children— the seventh generation on the farm-daughter, Reagan (11) and son, Jacob (8) arrive home from school. Now, rather than being the child tagging along helping her dad, she gets to teach her children as they tag along with her. She finds purpose in knowing that she is raising two farm kids.

I keep a quote on my refrigerator that I clipped from a newspaper

years ago to keep me going on the tough days," Laura said. "The quote by Talana Mathiowetz reads 'It's a privilege and an honor to farm. We care for the land and our animals and in return they take care of us. It's a gift we give to our kids, so it will be there for them and their children."

Every Junior Member's Dream Cow

Oftentimes, those who fall in love with Holsteins can recall a calf who changed it all for them. The calf that you spend hours on end preparing for the show ring or just admiring her at the bunk. A calf that writes a story with you as you grow as a person and as she grows into a cow. In the early 90's, that special calf for Laura was Pine-Shelter Lucina Fargo or as Laura called her, Lucy. She was the daughter of Laura's favorite cow, Pine-Shelter Lyda Lucky Royal.

"I poured my whole heart into that black calf," Laura said. "She was born in December and she was always up eating. She came along at a time in my life where it was nice to be able to go to the barn and just sit and admire her. She was every junior member's dream cow."

Laura was able to talk her dad into letting her travel to many local, state and national shows with Lucy.

"I remember being at state fair and calling home to my dad. He said if she was first or second, we would sign her up for Madison. That's kind of how it all started with her," Laura recalled. "We were able to calve her in just right every year and she showed in every year at Madison all the way from the December calf class to the 100,000 lb cow class."

In 1996, Lucy was the Grand Champion of the Grand National Jr. Show in Louisville. She went on to be the grand champion of the Junior Show at World Dairy Expo in 1997. Furthermore, she was a four-time Jr. All-American. In 1997 and 1998, she was the mother of two All-American Produce Nominations. She was also the 2010 Minnesota Holstein Association Brood Cow of the Year. Over half of the Pine Shelter herd can trace back to her. Lucy is one of two cows with the

"She was the reason I got to travel and meet so many people that are still in my life today," Laura said. "I was alone with her when she passed away at 12 years of age. I wasn't sure I could love a cow like that again, but I did."

Continued Show Ring Success

Lucy's granddaughter, Pine Shelter Cheyenne EX-95 became a household name in Minnesota when she earned Grand Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion at World Dairy Expo in 2003. Her sire was a homebred bull (Lucy's son), Pine-Shelter Laser Lindy.

"Cheyenne was my sister Molly's cow," Laura explained. "I got to be her caretaker while Molly was in college. We were seriously hoping for top 10 that year and had compiled the best show crew on the fairgrounds."

Laura took a break from showing after Cheyenne died to focus on raising her children while they were young. However, she began to feel a yearning to show again when Cheyenne's granddaughter, Pine-Shelter Carlia Atwood-ET caught her eye. Carlia was the 2017 All-Minnesota 150,000 lb Cow and Best Bred and Owned at the State Show.

The history of their Registered Holstein herd adds more meaning to the success of their home-bred cows in the show ring.

"I love all of the history," Laura said. "Our entire herd goes back to six cows that my great grandfather bought from the University of Minnesota in 1919. He kept a diary of his travels in a boxcar with the cows. We are very proud that our entire herd is homebred."

Blessed To Do What She Loves

After an extremely tough winter during which Pine Shelter Farms lost a heifer barn and a storage barn, the Alberts have had some tough conversations about the future of their farm. However, they have

always found a way to stay positive and keep moving forward.

"I'm just happy we are still milking," Laura said. "I get to get up and go to the barn. I see so many of my friends exiting the business, and I feel very blessed we are able to do what we love."

When asked what advice she can offer to other young women who are interested in dairy farming, Laura had several pieces of advice and words of encouragement.

- "Remember that you are never alone. It is important to find a support system such as the Dairy Moms or Dairy Girl Network groups on Facebook."
- "Make sure to have hobbies outside of the farm. I enjoy reading, taking pictures, and spending time with my kids."
- "The cows are important, but so are the people in our lives. We are only here for a little while, so you have to know when to walk out of the barn."
- "After being in a few major cow crashes, always know your exit and watch your back, don't forget how big these animals are!"
- "All you can really do is your best. Don't forget to take care of yourself!"
