


MEET YOUR MINNESOTA DJM APPLICANT:



One of the great people I've had the chance to connect with, Sherry Newell, once told me "Be flexible." It is funny to me how such a simple quote and idea has become a mantra for me not only in the show ring, but also in my professional career so far. There are always times in life when my direction gets rocky, but I always think back to what she was trying to tell me that day. "Be flexible" isn't about being something that you can't be, but it is about how there are opportunities to make any situation better for you and others.

My name is Jacob Schaefer, and I am the son of Tracy Schaefer and Karla Smieja. Growing up, I spent most of my days in the barn on our farm outside of Little Falls, MN following my dad around as he milked, cleaned, and did skid loader chores around the farm. I even went to my first cow show (the Olmsted County Fair) at only a couple of days old, where I got my first taste of showing that has become such a big part of my life. I saw a lot of great cows come through our 50-cow tie-stall barn before my parents' divorce, and I wish I had been old enough to truly appreciate that. From the likes of TJ-Pollema Redliner Shania-Red EX-95-4E to Silvermine Advent Tally EX-93-2E, I got to work with great cows every day, but my view of the industry changed forever when SL-Acres Absolute Jana-Red was born.

Jana was out of my "J" family that was my first cow family that I ever owned, and as she was my baby born during a summer off in middle school, she was spoiled more than her predecessors. For the first time, I looked forward to showing "my own" animal in the ring that very next summer which meant a lot of long nights walking her after chores. Around that same time, I remember my mom saying to my brother, Quentin, and I: "Everything has a price, all of our animals have to have a price." My mom was big on the fact that we can't completely outvalue our love for our cows, and if an offer comes in, we must consider it. In the summer of 2015, Jana would become my ultimate test when she went on to become the Reserve Jr. Champion of the Red & White State Show and Jr. Champion of the Red & White Junior State Show as a summer yearling. Jana ended up getting sold to a farm in Pennsylvania, but she ended up funding my show string for the next few years. I will be honest it was very hard to say goodbye to my first animal so soon, but I believe it was one of my

first steps in my journey of being flexible.

Flexibility became my thing by chance, and it does not make certain decisions any easier. I learned early through my parent's divorce and selling Jana that being flexible made my life easier in many ways. I had to be flexible with my time by balancing spending time with both of my parents, and I had to be flexible with my energy as I tried to help both parents with chores on their respective farms. I had to be flexible with visiting my family or going to cow shows during the summer, and I had to be flexible with doing homework on the go or doing more work in the industry to gain experience. Being flexible is something that took me a long time to be okay with, and there were points where I felt like I was only compromising and not gaining anything. I continue to make steps toward being okay with every decision I make.

In high school, flexibility came in ways of learning and listening. Learning in different ways became a skill to master due to tougher and specialized classes that I began to take. I learned through a multimedia class that I have natural skills in online design and computer programs, but I also expanded on these skills while learning in different ways for different programs. I had to start listening to outsiders trying to help me, but I also had to listen to myself. Now I can use those new ways to learn and listen by applying them to similar principals in college classes, personal promotion of my animals, and caretaking of my animals. Learning and listening go hand in hand which is why it is not surprising for me that I made major changes to both around the same time.

Big issues and flexibility could be used as a title slide for the year of 2020, and I can say that from a very raw first-person point of view. I was one of the people that believed at first that we would only be out of school for a couple days when the COVID-19 pandemic hit, but that became less possible as time went by. couple days when the COVID-19 pandemic hit, but that became less possible as time went by. As a senior in high school at the time, I had to be positive, and I had to believe that everything would get better before graduation. Again, this would not come true, but my classmates and I remained flexible in any way to have any normalcy on our graduation day. It is still hard to

believe how much we had to miss during the pandemic and how many memories we lost. The year of 2020 struck the world with huge changes as being flexible became the only option for everyone. Masks and social distancing slowly became required which meant that graduation, cow shows, and a lifelong goal of getting on the Minnesota Junior Holstein Board were difficult to achieve. A parade was done for graduation rather than a commencement. World Dairy Expo was cancelled which sent us to Utah to exhibit at a national show. Applying and voting for MJHA had to be done online. We put new strategies together that year to allow everything to happen, although it may have been very different from what was originally intended. Flexibility always resulted in good.

Some of the positive memories, connections, and skills I have today were direct results of the flexibility that I had during that year. Going to the Utah national show was not in the plans at all, but we decided to go for it. As a result, I keep in contact with many of the people I met on that trip as friends and mentors, but flexibility showed itself not only in the choice to take the 20- hour journey but also in our decisions along the way. There was no plan to blow two tires in rural areas of North Dakota and Montana, and there was no plan to be five hours behind schedule at each of our stops. Looking back on those things now makes me realize that what I got out of that trip was way more important than what we put in. Flexibility can mean taking loss and turning it into gain.

A large part of what keeps me going while I'm away at college the last few years is that I can bring my knowledge back and use it to better the life of my spoiled animals at home. It hurtssome days being far away from the animals, but I turn that feeling of loss to push me to gain more from school. One of my spoiled babies that makes me miss home is King-Lane Abs Always-Red-ET Ex-93 or "Abby," because she has helped me grow up. The days away make the days in the show ring with her feel so much sweeter. I have never been prouder of any of my cows than her, and I just got the news that she was named Junior All-American R&W Aged Cow. Words cannot describe the raw emotions that I feel right now. Abby has also taught me many lessons about owning cattle, especially that life may not always work out in my favor and some things come way harder than they should. Abby continues to show me the value in being flexible.

Pushing myself to be flexible in college has given me amazing opportunities through jobs and networking. I have spent a lot of time trying to figure out how I can make all the small activities fit into my calendar, but it has paid off in ways I couldn't have guessed. During the summer of 2021, I worked for Ash Grove Dairy, a 1200-cow Holstein dairy, outside of Lake Benton, MN, as a catch-all dairy intern. I spent different weeks of that summer specializing in things from calf care to herd checks to dry-offs and everything in between, but I was called on that summer to take a major step into an overnight maternity role for two separate weeks due to being short staffed at that position. Coming from a small dairy farm with little dairy experience. on a farm that size, I was hesitant at first, but I told myself to be flexible. I ended up learning a lot from the experience about critical thinking, observation, and procedures. Without those experiences, I was less likely to get my foot inside the door at a global business like DeLaval the next summer.

DeLaval gave me a great opportunity when they selected me to become one of their first corporate interns during the summer of 2022. I spent that summer in a market analysis role with main focuses on a total cost analysis for the new E-500 Rotary System and a market surveying project in areas of northern Nevada and California. These two projects allowed me to work on my skills in Excel, learn about parts and supply chain, and meet a lot of industry people from all sides. I had the opportunity to meet hundreds of employees that I wouldn't have otherwise met due to a large gathering planned as a regrouping of the company after years of being separated by the pandemic in some way. It is hard to fathom how something that caused such a rift in my life also allowed me a bigger opportunity to network than I could've ever had otherwise.

Both projects I worked on brought a lot of unexpected twists and turns that required flexibility. The Total Cost project brought fun software and computer problems that would often set us backwards a few steps, but the project still got done with the flexibility of an elongated timeline. The market surveying project meant I had to be flexible on meeting times with farmers as well as creative in my questioning to get the most out of the visit. My flexibility almost came to a head when the ending of my internship took yet another unexpected turn when I tested positive for COVID two days before my final presentation date. Working through the situation, I ended up staying in Chicago for a couple extra days until I could fly home. I finished by doing my presentation via zoom once all required parties had another opening to listen.

The team I worked with at DeLaval was very receptive of my work with the Minnesota Junior Holstein Association that lead to me helping organize and run the junior side of the National Holstein Convention in Sioux Falls, SD, in 2022 as well. Never having been to a National Holstein Convention before, I didn't know quite what to expect, but I made sure to do anything I could to make the convention a success. It was my first time going to convention, and I had to help organize events. At times, it was a lot to balance during the week. My previous two years on the junior board as president and historian gave me the skills I needed to help with convention in any capacity.

My duties at National Convention consisted of Junior Registration Chair, Welcome Night Co-chair, Junior Mixer Co-chair, and more. These duties kept me busy most of the week, but when I wasn't helping with those events, I was helping get decorations for other events set up or even running a door for a Quiz Bowl room. All in all the week gave me a very bare bones look at how a convention of that size is run, and we were all very happy with how the week turned out. A lot of people don't realize that a convention of that size takes more than a year to organize and get funding for, but I learned so much from the experience. I again had to be flexible to truly appreciate the value of the skills and connections that are made through the process.

I will always remind myself how being flexible can take so many different forms. Flexibility does not make the decision easier, but the outcome can be better than ever desired. Flexibility means learning and listening in new and important ways. Flexibility may be the only option but being flexible gives me more options. Flexibility can always result in good and positive outcomes. Flexibility can make a good employee into a great employee. Lastly, flexibility makes me appreciate the process and the results in a much larger capacity. For those reasons, I will always remember to "Be flexible."

- 1. State show entry fee \$20 entry fee per animal to be paid online via FairEntry. NO
- 2. There will be no reserved stall fee and cattle will be stalled prior to arrival.
- 3. State show entries must be received by June 14th, 2023. Entries receive after the deadline will be assessed a \$50 per animal fee. Entries received after June 26 will be \$100. Substitutions will be permitted.
- 4. All identification papers must be presented and identified in the exhibitor's name, except papers presented with a signed transfer and fees attached. Transfers and fees will be collected and sent to the Holstein Association USA. No calls will be made to verify ownership. Animals that are going on to other shows will be verified with Holstein Association USA. If these transfers are not recorded there within 90 days of our state show, the exhibitor(s) will be ineligible to show at a Minnesota Holstein sponsored district or state show for the following calendar year.
- 8. Exhibitors to the state show must sign the vaccination verification which indicates that all animals he/she is exhibiting have been vaccinated for LEPTO, IBR and BVD within six months of the show.
- 10. A rosette ribbon to the top dollar value production winner will be presented in classes 13-18. Exhibitors, who wish to be recognized for production, must send in all production information at time of entry. From there the records will be officially verified by DHIA. Any records sent in after the entry deadline will not be eligible for receiving production recognition.
- 12. Premier Breeders (Bred and Owned) the owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. Please Note: To qualify for Bred & Owned Awards, one of the original owners must be listed as one of the current owners. JUNIOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

The show will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, June 30, 2022.

All entries must be in place and checked in 24 hours prior to the show. 1. Exhibitors must be a minimum of nine years old to participate, but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1 in the year competing. Members who become 21 years of age during the current year will be allowed to compete in Junior activities until December 31st of the current year and not beyond that time.

2. All junior members will show under Minnesota Junior Holstein Association rules and animals must be shown by the owner except in extreme situations and then approved by the junior show committee a week prior to the show.

3. A junior member is a boy or girl with a paid membership in the Minnesota Junior Holstein Association.

4. Any animal shown at the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show with the immediate family's prefix does not need the exhibitors name on the paper. (Immediate family means parents and children). *This rule only applies for the MN Jr. State Show. National rules state that animals must be in the junior's name(s) by July 15 of the current year.

6. Entry blanks MUST be filled in completely as to class, birth date, name, and registration number of the animal, as well as both the sire and dam. Entry forms and fees are due June 14th, 2023.

7. Health Certificates: The State of Minnesota Board of Animal Health has made the decision not to require a brucellosis test on exhibition cattle.

8. The MN Junior State Show will start at 8:00 a.m. on June 17. The first class will be Class 22-J, then Class 10-J through 18-J, then Class 1-J through 7-J ending with Class 23-J and Class 24-J.

9. Novice Class: Novice Calves may be from class 1-J, 2-J and 3-J. The calf may be shown in another class but the novice show person may not show in another class. Please remember to keep the size of the calf appropriate for the youth's ability. Ownership rules do not apply to novice class show person. The animals will NOT be placed and all youth will receive the same award.

10. All junior exhibitors are subject to the Code of Conduct Rules. Show people if possible should wear white pants and a white T-shirt or clean clothes.

ENTRY FEE

Entry fee for the Minnesota Junior Holstein Show is \$5 per head. If you would like to participate in both the open and junior show, both fees need to paid, and you need to mark your entry forms as such. The fee is per head therefore you do not need to pay \$5 for a novice calf if the calf is already being exhibited in a different class. Checks can be made out to MJHA. Only one animal per class will be cataloged. Substitutes can be made at the show.

JUNIOR BRED AND OWNED

Junior Bred and Owned Class are based off the National Rules To be eligible for Junior Bred and Owned, the name(s) listed as breeder and owner on the registration certification must be the same. Adult-Junior partnerships are not acceptable. Family unit or farm partnership will not qualify for Bred and Owned unless all partners are Junior members and listed on the certificate under breeder and owner.

TRANSFERS

A reminder to all juniors to get your junior state show animals transferred or registered now. Under the new rule of Holstein Association USA, the transfer application now must be received by the Holstein Association by July 15 for both cows and heifers. However, animals shown in the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show must be transferred into the exhibitor's name by May 31, 2023.

- If papers are late coming, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to call Holstein Association USA so they have the papers in hand on the day of the show.
- There will be absolutely no transfer or registration applications accepted for junior show animals and there will be no phone calls or other such inquiries made to Holstein Association USA on junior animals.

4-H LEASE ACCEPTANCE

The Minnesota Junior Holstein Association will be accepting 4-H leases for the MJHA State Show. To enter a leased animal, you need to submit a copy of the registration paper and a copy of your lease affidavit that has been stamped by your extension office.

Ann Marie and Steve have continued that tradition and rest assured future generations will be an integral part of the Holstein family. SENIOR BREEDER AWARD

Passion and dedication are an easy description of how Dan Koester approaches dairy farming and Registered Holsteins. He has spent his career on the farm that his parents, LaVerne and Clarice, originally established in 1956 with 28 cows. Dan was always involved in helping care for the animals on the farm when he was young. He developed a greater interest in dairy as he became more involved in FFA in high school. He was on the FFA dairy judging teams and won high individual as a sophomore. After high school he attended Highland Community College and then continued on to the University of Wisconsin-Madison, graduating in 1977 with a degree in dairy science. While attending Madison, he was active in dairy judging and won high individual honors at Harrisburg. Dan returned to the home farm after graduating and joined into a partnership with his brother and parents. At the same time he also worked for 14 years as a GMS evaluator for ABS. They purchased their first registered Holstein in the early 70s, and Dan continued to build the herd to be 100% registered after returning from college.

In 1983, Dan married his wife Amber and they had five children, Lance, Kyle, Brent, Alissa, and Bria. Dan's love for farming has influenced his children. Today Lance, Kyle, Brent, Bria, and daughter-in-law Cynthia, join Dan and Amber to make up the workforce at Koester Dairy. In 2010, a new freestall barn and milking parlor was built to expand the herd which now consists of 420 cows and 400 replacement heifers. The current herd average is 37,467 milk, 1615 (4.3%) fat, and 1183 (3.15%) protein. The farm also includes 900 acres, growing corn, alfalfa, and soybeans.

Continuously trying to improve the farm has always been a focus, especially with the genetics of the herd. The herd is a 6 year recipient of Holstein Association's Herd of Excellence Award. In addition, the herd has also received Holstein Association's Progressive Genetics Award for 31 years and with a +2575 CTPI ranks as the #1 herd in Illinois. There have been numerous bulls sent to Al over the years and embryos exported internationally.

JUNIOR BREEDER AWARD

The farm began milking with just five cows the year he was born. The idea was to have a place for their four kids to learn a good work ethic, while living in a more surburban area. Through good breeding choices, their herd grew in quantity and quality with a focus on pedigrees. The kids took on the full responsibility of taking the animals to the shows, all while being active members of the Illinois Holstein Association.

This breeder continued his interest in the farm after pursuing a career in agricultural engineering. When he met his wife, who was also raised on a dairy farm, they shared a passion for dairy cows and their commitment to the farm. Together, with Albert and Mary Etta they upgraded the farm by installing two robotic milkers and built a new barn for continued growth. They embraced their location and began welcoming the public to visit by hosting an ice cream social in 2019 with over a 1,000 people attending. Now, hosting up to 2 tours a week, visitors include local school groups, scouts and community members. They also partner with Midwest Dairy and have hosted Chicago Bears David Montgomery, as well as several tours for the IHSA Athletes.

With the second generation taking off at full speed and a change of ownership, they are now growing their own herd. Their focus remains on using only red and red carrier bulls that are robot ready and high type. They have bred 3 Excellents, 24 very Goods all while owning 17 excellent and 24 Very Good Cows. They continue their long-time dedication to the Illinois Holstein Association by serving on many committees over the years, currently serving Secretary for IHA. These breeders have worked hard in order to continue the legacy of the farm so it can carry on to the third generation, with their two children, just 40 short years later. The Outstanding Holstein Boy and Girl awards are the highest honor that the Wisconsin Junior Holstein Association can bestow on members. The winners of these awards are chosen based on their Distinguished Junior Member applications and an interview. Our 2022 recipients were recognized at the Wisconsin Junior Holstein Convention at the beginning of January. Get to meet the winners, Lauren Siemers and Matthew Gunst.

Lauren Siemers



January 7, 2023 will forever be the host of one of my most special Holstein memories, being named the Wisconsin Outstanding Holstein Girl. I was honored in my home county, fifteen miles from my family's farm, surrounded by so many of the people that made this dream a reality.

My name is Lauren Siemers and I'm the 20-year-old daughter of Paul and Jenny Siemers

and sister to Josh and Jake. Together with my aunt, uncle, and cousins, we complete the fifth and sixth generations of Holstein involvement dating back to 1890. While the honor of Outstanding Girl is given to an individual, it's essential to give credit to my family and the numerous mentors and role models I've had that have shaped my path.

My story starts at Siemers Holsteins, my family's Registered Holstein and crop operation in Newton. We focus on "Genetics for Cow People," and though I've enjoyed time spent in the show ring, I also learned the value of functional, high-producing cows at a very young age. Throughout the years, I've been able to work with high genomic animals at our on-farm TransOva satellite center, help with caring for recipient heifers, and learn to prepare our cows and heifers for all levels of show. Now, as junior at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh studying marketing, I still love coming home during the summer and whenever possible to help around the farm and work with several area youth who lease calves to show. I've also spent the past 10 years breeding and developing my very own herd of Holsteins, using the same Siemers prefix that my entire family has used since the foundation of the farm.

I feel very fortunate to have been born and raised in an area that values and supports dairy farming. The multitude of farms in Northeast Wisconsin has lent itself to dozens of

competitive dairy kids with whom I've grown up forming teams and friendships. My earliest competitive involvement outside of the county fair began at age six when I started to attend my aunt Janina's dairy quiz bowl practices in the summer. Though I wasn't very competitive at first, three of my great friends and I formed a team in 2015, and this year we won the state contest for the fourth time. I can certainly appreciate the hundreds of hours my aunt and coach has spent preparing us for these contests, and I look forward to representing Wisconsin in the national dairy bowl contest one last time.

While my aunt coached dairy bowl, my dad and my lifelong mentor Angie Ulness prepared our county for dairy judging. While I'd love to say I was a natural, until I was 13, I was awful! Aging into the senior division and learning to prepare reasons was the turning point for my judging career, and it even became a personal strength of mine. Manitowoc County has an excellent judging program, and my team worked hard to win the National 4-H Dairy Judging contest at World Dairy Expo in 2021. I also became one of the only youths in Wisconsin ever to win the top individual award at the state level twice; in 2019 and 2021. Now, I have the privilege of serving as an assistant coach and helping prepare the younger kids for contests!

I was always particularly interested in quiz bowl and dairy judging, but my advisors and family pushed me to be well-rounded and compete in everything the Wisconsin Junior Holstein Association had to offer. Dairy jeopardy, prepared public speaking, and essay contests enriched my junior involvement and have paid off tenfold. My favorite form of involvement was serving as the 2019 Wisconsin Holstein Princess. Having the best seat in the house at World Dairy Expo and pinning the grand champion rosette on Barbara's halter was special, but what I enjoyed even more was traveling Wisconsin and connecting with hundreds of kids while promoting Holstein cattle.

Though I don't attend an agricultural college, I have no doubt in my mind that upon graduation, I will return to the agriculture industry. I love sales and marketing and hope to help farmers market their products with innovative strategies to drive consumption.

I am honored to be the 2022 Outstanding Holstein Girl and can never thank the people in my life enough for all they've done. My parents, brothers, aunt, uncle, and cousins, along with Angie Ulness, Jennifer Meyer, Amanda Smith, and Laura and Mara at WHA, have been incredible. I doubt I would be the woman I am today without them. I also want to thank all the kids that have impacted my life: my teammates, the Manitowoc/ Calumet junior membership, and the countless friends I've made since my first convention twelve years ago.

My ultimate goal is to give back to the organizations that have shaped me so that younger members and future generations can have the same, or even better, opportunities than I've had. If I could give advice to a young junior Holstein member, it would be to start early and try hard. Keep at it even when you feel defeated and take all the opportunities before you. The end of your junior involvement will come faster than you think, and you'll be so grateful for all you have done!

"Winning isn't everything. It's the only thing." Throughout my Junior Holstein career, I often felt as if this was the mantra I was supposed to live by. Winning was the highest goal going into every competition and show, and oftentimes being the only outcome to make participation seem worthwhile. However, after reflecting on my experiences in the Wisconsin Junior Holstein

Association after being named the 2022 WI Outstanding Holstein Boy, I cannot help but feel this statement could not be more false.

My first convention may not have been extremely successful, but it dipped my toes in the water of the Wisconsin Junior Holstein Association and got me hooked.

My participation in the show ring and Wisconsin Junior Holstein Association activities skyrocketed after that first year, participating in the speaking contests, dairy jeopardy and dairy

bowl contests, even representing Wisconsin at several National Junior Holstein Conventions along the way. Through these events, I was able to extensively improve my speaking abilities, dairy knowledge and social skills. As a young member, I always looked up to those who were older role models in the Junior Holstein Association, and I strived to be like them.

As I progressed in my involvement, I began to crave more in my experience. Naturally, the first year I was old enough I decided to run for the southeast Junior Activities Committee position. FEATURING GUEST SPEAKER JORDAN SIEMERS OF NEWTON, WISCONSIN

2023 MINNESOTA PDCA DISTINGUISHED BREEDER Arnie and Kris, Gruenes Family

Twin Spruce Farms is family-owned and operated by Arnie and Kris Gruenes. The Gruenes' have seven children and seven grandchildren. Three of their children work on the farm daily and two of their sons help when they can. The home farm is located in Richmond, Minnesota, where they milk 1,620 Holstein cows. The second farm, known as Twin Spruce Farm North, is located in Perham, Minnesota, and is home to around 1.380 cows.

Twin Spruce Farms has a heifer raising facility called Timber Hill Growers in Sauk Centre, Minnesota. Additionally, they have five other custom grower sites for their heifers and dry cows. The Gruenes family recently purchased a site two miles from the Richmond dairy and are working on building a calf facility. This location will handle all newborn calves that are currently at a custom calf raiser. The farm grows and harvests all of their own corn and alfalfa, totaling around 3,800 acres of corn and 1,100 acres of alfalfa, and purchases additional commodities.

In addition to the dairies, Arnie and Kris also own and operate Triple A Pumping, a custom manure application business. Two of their sons together oversee the daily operations of the pumping business, and this entity has made footprints in not only Minnesota, but several other states. Another unique aspect of Twin Spruce Farms is that they have an IVF satellite center for Boviteg at their home farm.

The Gruenes Family can be described as the epitome of "teamwork makes the dream work." It is truly a family-run operation that values the time they spend together on the farm, as well as their employees that are treated like family. Arnie Sr. oversees all the operations within the family's entities. He also serves as manager of all building projects the family has done throughout the years. Arnie Sr. has an assistant who oversees the herd's genetic programs. Kris is the Business Manager and handles the bookwork for both Twin Spruce Farms and Triple A Pumping and is in charge of HR for their businesses. Arnie Jr. can be found leading one of the pumping crews and helping out wherever is needed. He enjoys maintaining equipment, repairs and working with the cattle. One of his favorite things to do on the farm is run the chopper. Andy, the youngest son, also works on a Triple A Pumping crew, and enjoys trucking cattle, harvesting feed and trucking hay and straw in the off season. Ashley is the Assistant Business Manager but can often be found lending a helping hand with fresh cows and herd checks and working with the show cattle. Additionally, the Gruenes children can be found showing dairy cattle at many shows throughout the Midwest.

They are proud to have many employees that they value as family members. Altogether, 70 employees help the farm run smoothly and contribute to the success of Twin Spruce Farms and Triple A Pumping.

Arnie has been growing and marketing Twin Spruce Farm's genetics for the past 11 years. Consequentially, they have seen a notable impact on their registered Holstein genetics and contributed to progress on a worldwide scale. The T-Spruce prefix has built quite a reputation within the bull and semen markets. Arnie, Kris, and family have over 50 bulls in the stud services with Select Sires, who is now the main receiver of the farm's elite studs. Alta Genetics, Semex and ST Genetics also receive some of the Gruenes' top bulls.

Notable Bulls from Twin Spruce Farms:

- 7HO12724 T-SPRUCE SUPRSHT WIGGINS-ET was the very first T-Spruce bull entered into the studs in 2015.

- 7HO15821 T-Spruce G Frost Bite recognizes 1242 NM and +DPR.
- 7HO016468 T-SPRUCE PHOENIX 2176- ET is one to watch for in 2023.

In 2022, their cow Hillrose Denver Piper took 2nd place in the milking yearling class and best udder in the Midwest Fall National Show. She then went on to receive 14th place at the World Dairy Expo. Twin Spruce Farms is also home to many Gold Medal Dams, Dam of Merits, National Star Performers and Regional Elite Performers.

Arnie has had the privilege of keynote speaking in Hungary twice about their genetic advancements and crops. Additionally, their herd is often recognized for their outstanding rolling herd average. In 2022, they held their first sale, the "Future Opportunity Sale", which highlighted T-Spruce's stellar genetics. Through this they were able to sell IVF sessions, embryos and live animals throughout the U.S. and countries abroad.

The Gruenes' have been valued members of the Minnesota Holstein Association, MJHA, and Red & White Holstein Associations for several years. Kris currently serves on the Minnesota Holstein Board as the Vice President and has been a Junior Advisor for the past eight years. Arnie and Kris both serve on the Meeker County Fair Board, they enjoyed hosting breakfast on the farm in Perham, and are very active with their church where they help with dinners, raffles, and chair the annual fish fry. Arnie Jr., Ashley and Andy have been members of the MJHA attending numerous All-Breeds Conventions, exhibiting at State Shows and volunteering during other events. In 2021, Twin Spruce Farms was the Minnesota State Fair Showcase Herd, where they showcased a large group of their Red & White cows during all 12 days of the Great Minnesota Get-Together.

Meet the Family!

She is currently in her 23rd year of teaching and a fun fact about Seena is that she was the 1999 Region 9 Dairy Princess and a Princess Kay of the Milky Way Finalist! Dan graduated from Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted High School and attended Ridgewater College in Willmar, MN. He currently serves as the MN Farm Bureau President.

Community Involvement

The Glessing Family has been valued community members and volunteers where they can, especially if it's centered around agriculture. Previously they have been named the Wright County Farm Family of the Year. Truths about their Life!

Farming can be tough. Some days are better than others. We are very fortune the children are of the age to operate the daily functions of the farm if necessary. They are very willing and extremely able to do the day to day operations on our farm. Realizing that sometimes you just aren't going to get it all done and that's okay is just fine! The kids have a friendly competitive nature between themselves in the ring and seeing how their animals do on appraisal day or milk test date. We see them continuing to improve their genetics as we continue to grow the herd into what it needs to be to continue in the dairy business. One of a parent's biggest accomplishments is seeing our kids do drastically better than we did when we were showing at their age. By looking at both health and type traits, our improvement in bull selection is finally starting to show some dividends.

It is evident that the Glessing Family has made a profound impact on Minnesota's dairy community through work within their communities and through their jobs. It will be exciting to see where the Holstein association takes the family in their future endeavours!
