
"The first time we classified we had a BAA of around 100, and the last time we were at 110.8, so we made some improvements," Dave says.

### Youth Recognized at Nicollet County Holstein Meeting

Youth recognition and youth sponsorship were a big part of the Nicollet County Holstein Association's annual meeting held Monday, March 27 at Swany's in Courtland. The group met in conjunction with the Nicollet County DHIA since many members are involved in both organizations. The two meetings were held on either side of a noon lunch, which was sponsored by Isaacson Sales & Service of Lafayette.

Receiving plaques as outstanding youth members were Aiden Schroeder and Dominic Stoecker.

Schroeder of Courtland received the Holstein Association's award as the Outstanding Junior Boy for his work with Registered Holsteins. Though he's only 10 years old, Schroeder has been busy with a variety of dairy activities.

Aiden has shown at the state junior show four times, attended the state junior convention four times, taken part in dairy bowl twice and the dairy speaking contest once. He has exhibited at the Southern Minnesota Youth Dairy Show, the Brown County fair, and has taken a calf to the nursing home to share with residents.

Schroeder has four 4-H dairy project animals this year, all Registered Holsteins, and also shows beef calves.

Stoecker, of Nicollet, received the club's award as the Outstanding Senior. Dominic, 18, is also involved in FFA at Nicollet High School where he's a senior.

Dominic has attended the state junior convention and has taken part in dairy bowl and dairy judging. He got into Holsteins and cattle showing through Tarik and Jasenko Gavranovic and has shown cattle at the county fair. He hopes to advance to the state fair this year.

Stoecker has five 4-H dairy project animals this year, two are Registered Holsteins.

Eleven county junior members attended the All-Breeds Junior Convention at Rochester March 17-18. Alex Schroeder won his division of the speech contest but declined a trip to national as his family will be relief milking for a family that is going. Other county juniors also took part in contests. Jacob Pehrson will be a youth advisor.

The Schroeder kids—Alex, Aiden, and April—reported on youth activities they've taken part in

during the past year. Alex told about competing in the display board and speaking contests at national. He won his division of the display board contest. Aiden talked about the state junior convention and April about the state junior show last summer.

Nicollet County member Jasenko Gavranovic shared his experiences as National Distinguished Junior Member Semi-Finalist at the National Convention.

In action taken during the business meeting, members approved sponsoring the champion and reserve champion awards at the June 24 Southern Minnesota Youth Dairy Show, holding the pizza party for dairy exhibitors at the county fair, and providing financial assistance to the 11 juniors who attended the state junior meeting.

Nicollet County Holstein Association officers were elected at the meeting. Jason Schroeder is president, Jean Annexstad vice president, Ruth Klossner secretary, Peter Seitzer treasurer, and Matthias Annexstad a newly elected director.


### **ABOUT THE CONTEST**

This year the Minnesota Holstein Association relaunched the Minnesota Holstein of the Year contest. It is designed to recognize outstanding dairy cattle in the state of Minnesota. The purpose of this contest is to recognize and nominate notable animals that have made an impact on Minnesota's dairy community. This year, there were four entries. Those who nominated each animal were allowed to send in photos and a backstory of their chosen holstein. From there, entries were advertised on the MHA social media pages.

Voting took place during the 2023 All-Breeds Convention, and the winner was announced during the annual meeting. Minnesota's Holstein of the Year as voted on by the MHA is Liddleholme Diamnd Lust-ET, owned by Rachel Kurth and Sierra Swanson. Lust became a fan favorite after she won the Minnesota State Fair Holstein Show this past summer.

The MHA would like to congratulate Lust's owners and team for their great success and are proud to present them with the title of Minnesota's Holstein of the Year!

"Liddleholme Diamnd Lust-ET EX-93 is a 7th generation Excellent, sired by Diamondback, out of show-winning Liddleholme Resur Lu-ET EX-97. Lust was 1st place 4-Year-Old, Senior, and Grand Champion of a National Holstein show. Outside of the showring, Lust has bred back each year and is due back to be a 4th calf 5-Year-Old in 2023. She has had three natural heifer calves, and her oldest daughter by Jordy has alos had one natural heifer calf. In her current lactation, at 202 days in milk, she has produced 23,977 lbs. of milk, 4.0% fat, 3.2% protein, and ME \$6,379. On her high-test day thus far in her lactation, she produced 137 pounds of milk. With her modern stature, show ring accomplishments, and production, Lust is an exciting cow for today, and for the future."



### **HISTORY** CORNER

### Brj: Ronald Fustice

Sir Inka May is listed 27 times in the index of Holstein Friesian History, Diamond Jubilee Edition (1960). That fact in itself shows that Sir Inka May was one of the most popular and respected Holstein sires in his time.

In an editorial comment in the May 27, 1939 Holstein Friesian World, marking Sir Inka May's sixteenth birthday, Maurice Prescott noted that more than thirty of the breeders who regularly purchased ads in the magazine were using sires carrying the blood of Sir Inka May. Among these were Pabst Farms, whose Carnation Sensation, a Sir Inka May son, sired the 1938 All-American Get of Sire; Maytag Farms, who owned Prince Ormsby Inka May (the "Washing Machine bull"), another Sir Inka May son, Sir Piebe Inka May Fayne was at Osborndale Farm in Connecticut. George A. Paull, Matsqui, British Columbia owned Carnation Challenger, the Sir Inka May son of Hazelwood Ormsby Korndyke DeKol and Carnation Farms themselves were using several Sir Inka May sons including Inka the Great, a Sir Inka May son who was the sire of Carnation Inka Perfection who sired U.N.H Perfection Echo (VG-GM). Femco Farm in Minnesota used two Sir Inka May sons; Femco Royal and Carnation Ormsby

Sir Bessie.

In 1940, the Holstein Friesian World began a series of articles featuring bulls of the Holstein breed that have had the greatest impact. Sir Inka May\*RC was the first bull featured. Sir Inka May's lifespan extended almost 21 years when he was put to sleep.

Sir Inka May carried the red gene and spread the red hair color throughout North America. Using Mendel's Principles of Genetics, we can estimate that 50 percent of Sir Inka May's sons and daughters carried the red gene. Today, the name of Sir Inka May appears multiple times in nearly all pedigrees of red & white and red carrier Holsteins worldwide.

Through the years there has been a persistent rumour that Sir Inka May received the red gene from an Ayrshire bull. Unfortunately, this false information has appeared in print and spread by the misinformed.

Sir Inka May was sired by Sir Inka Superior Segis shown above. Minnesota Holstein Company sold Sir Inka Superior Segis privately to Carnation Milk Farms about 1927 where he sired at least two red &

white calves; one from Princess Adelina Segis \*RC 451366 on September 7, 1928 and a year later on Nov. 15, 1929, he sired a red and white calf from Leila Tulip Gem Butter King\*RC 226515.

Sir Inka May\*RC arrived at Carnation in April 1925. There is evidence that a red calf was born at Carnation in 1915 and in 1923/24, Carnation Segis Prospect\*RC (a son of the World Record Segis Pietertje Prospect) sired three red calves at Carnation. Sir Inka May sired 13 red calves at Carnation many from the best cows in the herd. Some of the dams are pictured on the next page.

Clothilde and Coronet (Both red carriers imported from Holland) appear in Sir Inka May's pedigree a total of 15 times. Clothilde appears in the pedigree of Sir Inka Superior Segis ten times. Clothilde appears three times in the pedigree of Sir Inka May's dam, May Walker Ollie Homestead. Coronet appears twice in Sir Inka May's pedigree through his dam who traces to Coronet's Hulleman, a son of Coronet's daughter, Corona. As we can see, there were plenty of red genes in Sir Inka May's ancestry. He didn't need help from an Ayrshire bull!

Annual Membership Meeting March 4, 2023

The membership of the Minnesota Holstein Association met on Saturday, March 4, 2023, at Treasure Island Resort & Casino in Red Wing, MN.

Committee meetings took place on Friday from 1 PM to 3 PM.

The annual meeting was called to order at 8:15 AM by president, Randy Gross. There were 40 members in attendance

Lucas P. offered an invocation.

Minutes were commended to everyone's reading. Eric Sonnek made a motion to approve the minutes as presented; seconded by Kris Gruenes. No discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Financial Report**

Ashley Swenson presented a financial report. She explained that the financial materials were printed in a supplemental packet that she encouraged everyone to review and invited the group to request clarification. National Convention was profitable. Finances have been reallocated appropriately. CDs were reinvested at higher interest rates and will resume a three-year rotation. Additional money has been directed into club scholarships. The breeder's seminars were offered free of charge. Additional membership activities are being explored. She encouraged the membership to share any ideas they have to improve organizational activities.

#### **Awards**

The Futurity XLVI winners were recognized.

#### Past President's Address

Andy Steinhagen shared that the longtime meritorious service award for 2023 was issued to Devoine and Linda Kruse. He stressed the importance of board members being present at board meetings.

#### **Staff Update**

Hailey Frericks introduced herself as the new marketing manager. The March publication is complete and should arrive shortly. She is working on a catalog for the Spring Sale. A summer intern has been hired; Brea Kieffer.

The Holstein of the Year program was explained, and the winner for 2023 is Liddleholm Diamnd Lust-ET owned by Sierra Swanson and Rachel Kurth. There were over two hundred voters and four nominees.

#### **Holstein Association USA Report**

John Meyer, Holstein USA CEO, was introduced and shared his appreciation to the organization for allowing him to attend. He congratulated the group on a successful National Convention hosted in 2022. Holstein USA is hiring. IDs were down two percent from the previous year. Holstein Complete had a good year. The classification program grew for the fourth year in a row.

John shared details of a recent Michigan State survey. Milking shorthorns and ayrshires will now be part of the classification program.

Randy directed everyone's attention to the convention program where committee meeting minutes are presented. Congratulations were given to PBR and PGH honorees.

#### MJHA Report

Taylor Fester, MJHA President, shared that the 2023 Junior All Breeds Convention will take place March 17-19 in Rochester, MN. Nearly 120 youth are registered to attend. Kaleb Kruse will be judging the junior state show in Hutchinson.

#### President's Address

Randy Gross expressed his gratitude for all of those planning and attending the 2022 National Convention. Randy Gross commended committee reports to the membership's reading and entertained any questions.

#### **Nominations Committee Report**

Randy Gross brought forward the nominees for the available director positions. He shared that four incumbents are on the ballot – Chris Schulze, Luke Olson, Nathan Donnay, and Trevor Ekkel. Erik Houdek has completed his first term and will not run again. Randy expressed his appreciation to Erik for his time. Additionally, two new individuals are running; Tony Kohls and Jacob Pehrson.

Randy Gross asked for further nominations from the floor. Andrew Steinhagen made a motion to cease nominations; seconded by Rebecca Groos. No discussion was held, and the motion carried unanimously.

Nominees gave a brief introduction. Ballots were distributed. Kenn Mueller and Andrew Steinhagen collected the ballots and counted them.

#### 2022 National Convention

Darrel Rennich gave a recap of the 2023 National Holstein Convention. He shared his sincere appreciation to all those who participated and attended. A slide show recapping National Convention was shared.

#### Sale/Raffle Committee

Nathan Donnay shared details of the upcoming Spring Sale to be held on April 22. Cowbuyer will be utilized once again. The March publication will have details of early consignments, and the group will continue to accept consignments until March 24. Randy Gross shared that there have been a few online sales in the past, and the committee is looking to grow the program.

Kris Gruenes shared that the raffle was discontinued this year. Minnesota Holstein will host the 2024 All Breeds Convention. During that time, a revamped raffle drawing will take place. Several locations are being explored and will be shared at a later date. They will plan for the second weekend in March.

#### **Show Committee**

Trevor Ekkel explained that State Show will take place in Hutchinson, MN, June 27 through July 1. Future show hosts were shared.

## **ANNUAL MEETING: MINUTES**

Randy shared the results of the board of director elections. Those elected to the board were Chris Schulze, Jacob Pehrson, Nathan Donnay, Trevor Ekkel, and Tony Kohls.

Ashley Swenson made a motion to destroy the ballots; seconded by Chris Schulze. No discussion was held and the motion passed unanimously.

#### Resolutions

Randy Gross shared that there were no proposed changes to resolutions 1-37. A motion was made by Lucas Plamann to accept resolutions 1-37 as presented with no changes; seconded by Rebecca Groos. No discussion was held, and the motion passed unanimously.

Proposed resolution 38 was read:

Resolution 38: Definition of "meat" labeling

Where as dairy cows produce both milk and meat products, and where as honest food labeling, including method of production, is paramount to consumer transparency.

Be it resolved that "meat" be reserved to food/protein sources originating from animal flesh exclusively.

A motion was made by Andrew Steinhagen to approve resolution 38 as presented; seconded by Rebecca Groos. No discussion was held. Motion passed unanimously.

Proposed resolution 39 was read:

Resolution 39: Staff and Director Thanks

Whereas, Minnesota Holstein business programs and events experienced a successful year, and; Whereas, Minnesota Holstein human resources are the wealth of our






