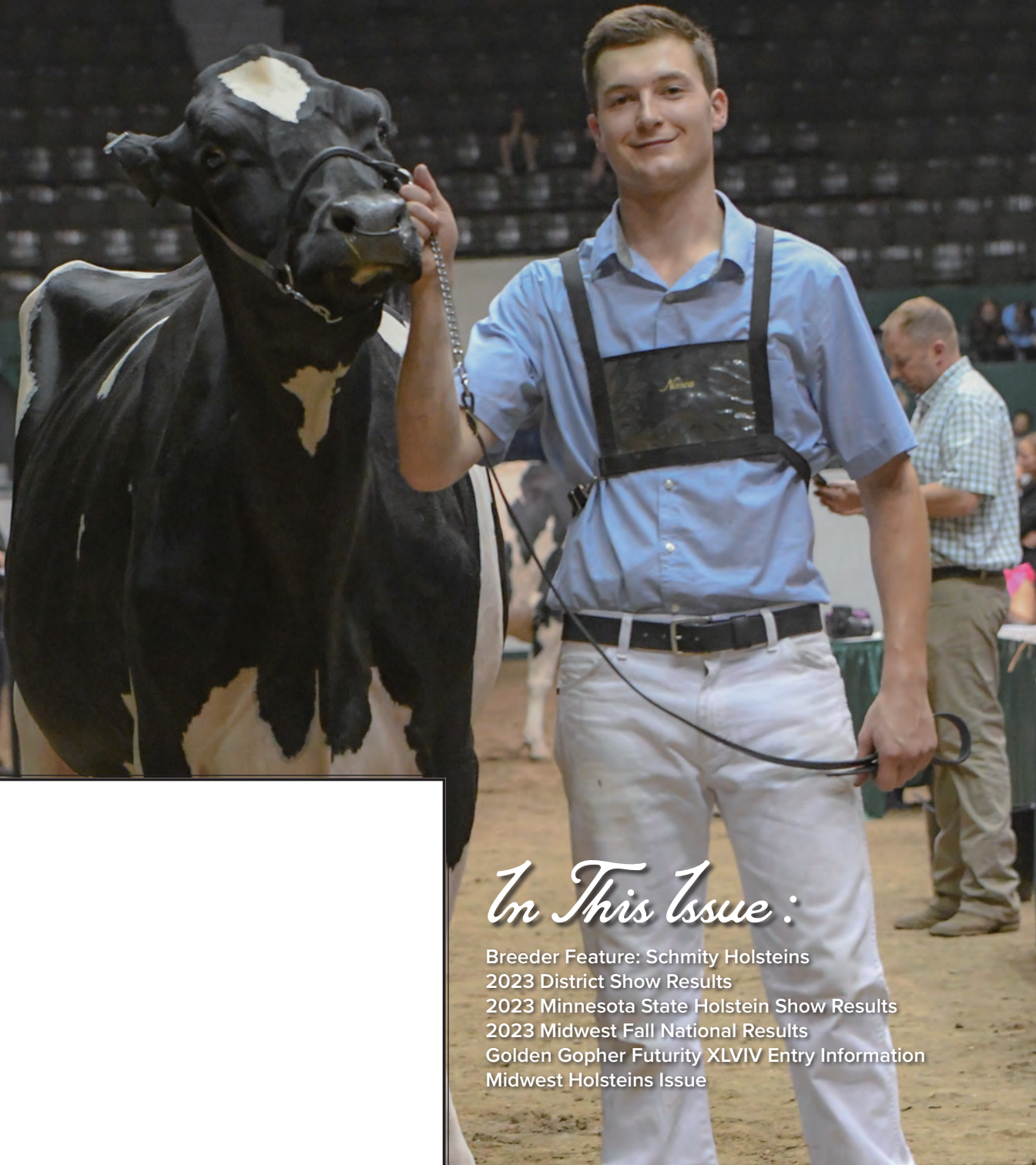

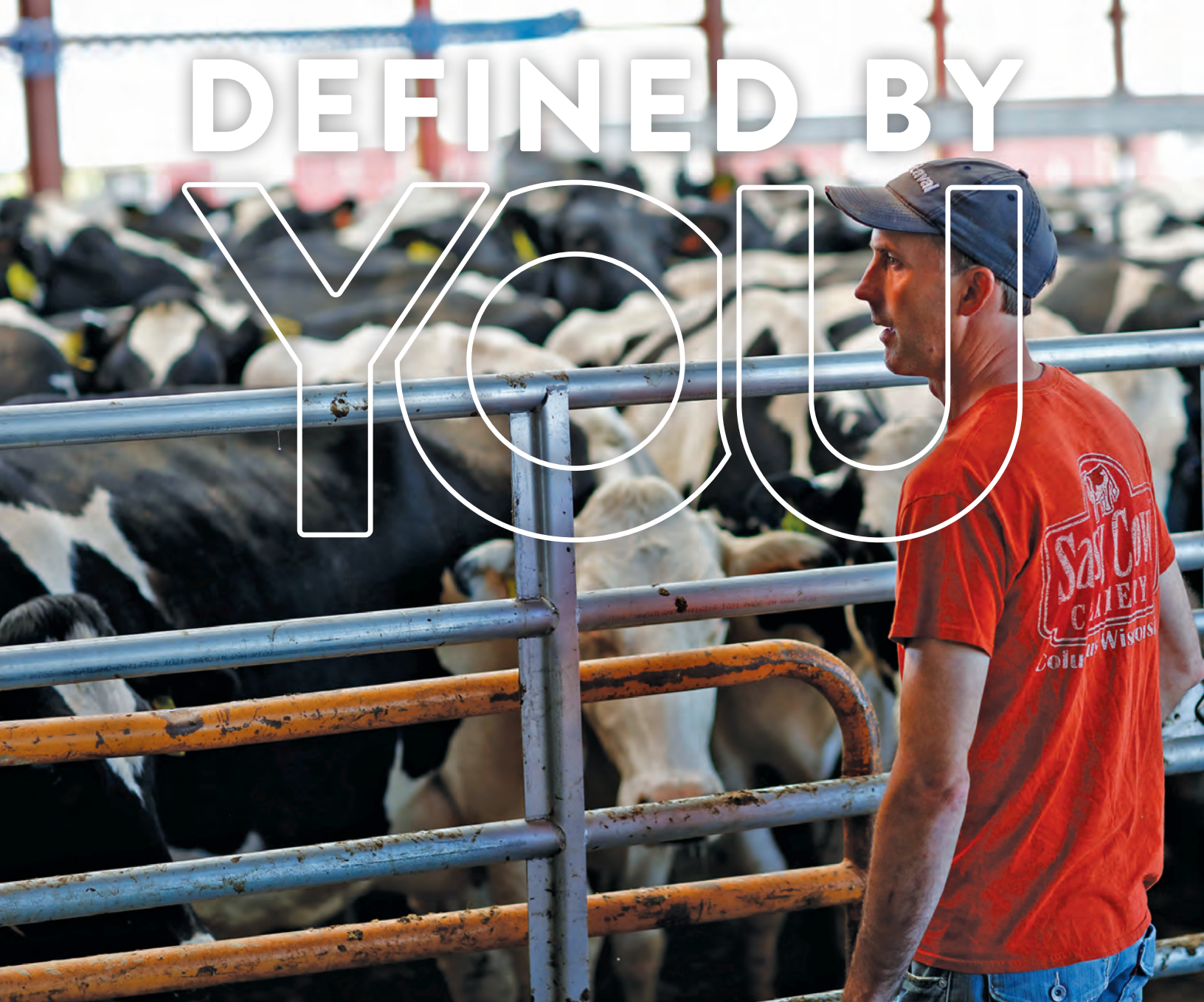

SCHMITY HOLSTEINS

Jon and Kim Schmit own and operate Schmity Holsteins in Owatonna, Minnesota. The farm has been in operation by the Schmit family for approximately 140 years. Today, they milk 220 cows in a double five flat parlor and farm around 250 tillable acres.

The farm is a fifth generation dairy operation. Jon grew up milking 40 grade holsteins with his parents. After attending and graduating from the University of Minnesota in 2004, Jon had plans to buy his own herd with his brother. Together the two bought their neighbors 50 cow registered holstein herd and rented their facilities for five years. In 2009, Jon and his brother decided to buy out their parents and expand to 200 cows. They built a new freestall barn and the double five flat parlor with automatic take offs, that could handle 60-70 cows an hour. A new calf barn was built in 2014 and the following year they put up a new heifer barn as well. Jon eventually bought his brother's half of the farm in 2019, and he now milks 220 registered holsteins and a few jerseys.

Schmity Holsteins is a proud, family run operation, with "all family besides a few part-time employees" running the farm. They have a few part-time highschoolers that help milk cows in the evenings. Besides Jon, the other family members that help on the dairy include: Jon's brother-in-law, Chris Slater, who works full-time doing field work, mixing feed and mechanical work; Jon's nephew milks cows; and Jon's dad is involved with the day-to-day work on the farm such as feeding calves and youngstock, assisting with odd jobs and driving tractor. Kim is currently not involved with the on-farm work and has a job off the farm.

Jon Schmit joined the Minnesota Holstein Association in high school and has been an active member for 25 years. He first joined to learn more about registered holsteins after purchasing a few of his own. Jon remembers wanting "to get more involved with the dairy in our community." He is now the president of his local Holstein club, the I-35 club, which he joined in high school.

Maximizing forages with cover crops

The Schmits have found great value in using cover crops to increase the amount of feed they can harvest from the land. When they harvest corn for silage in the fall, they like to plant triticale and winter rye as a cover crop, which then gets cut in mid-June for

heifer feed and extra cow feed. After that is harvested, they go in and plant some corn and the rest with a sorghum sudangrass mix.

Jon said "[Harvesting cover crops] allows us to add a lot more feed without buying feed, so by double cropping we gained a lot in forage production, which results in buying a lot less dry hay and heifer feed, which gives us a lot more opportunities."

With the 250 acres the Schmits farm, "everything we grow we feed" Jon said. 125 acres are used for corn silage. The remainder grows alfalfa or sorghum mix, and cover crops including triticale and sorghum sudangrass.

Breeding goal focused over the years

When genomics started getting hot in the dairy industry, the Schmit's found great success early on. They were on the cutting edge, selling high genomic bulls and embryos. In those early years, they focused on the number side of things like high index and high production.

Since the increased popularity in the genomics industry, their breeding goals have changed slightly. "The last few years it's been hard to compete" Jon says.

Schmit's still use about 95% high genomic bulls with high production, high fat and protein, along with key health traits. They also look for type, especially the bulls that provide strength and depth of body.

"We want cows that are going to last" said Schmit. "Over the years we've bred [cows with legs that are] too straight and posty. We now focus more on legs. Not using the extreme posty bulls anymore, but aiming for the middle, the more ideal foot and leg."

Schmit's run a standard double ovsynch reproduction program. Every cow starts the program on 50 days in milk and are bred by 75-80 days in milk. They use the AI 21 SCR ear tags for heat detection and watch rumination to monitor the overall health of each cow. They breed off of heats from the SCR system. Most of the heifers are bred from natural heats observed from the SCR as well. Jon still does a little flush work on his better heifers and cows but not as much as in the past.

Although Schmity Holsteins has not been too involved in the genomic market for a few years, they still flush some higher type animals. They have a few show families they continue to develop, with multiple cows

scored excellent. The Schmits lease some animals out to Jon's niece and stepdaughter to show at the local fair. Besides those few show animals, the rest of the herd is bred for production and functional type.

Nappy paved the way

One foundation cow Jon is very proud of is Schmity Bojangles Nappy VG-86, who is a Gold Medal Dam born in 2008. She was a high genomics cow that Schmit had a lot of fun working with. She flushed well and they sold many high progeny and embryos. Jon mentioned a daughter went to Oakfield Corners and he sold a few bulls to AI as they continued to develop the family.

Nappy had a big influence on the herd with a quarter of the herd tracing back to the Nappy cow family. Nappy was Schmit's first cow to produce more than 200 pounds of milk per day.

"All her offspring are very high production cows. She even had some daughters that made 50,000-pound records," exclaimed Jon.

For all of these reasons and more, Jon believes Nappy was the cow that had the biggest impact on Schmity Holsteins.

Looking into the future

Jon explained that Schmity Holsteins has come a long way in terms of expansion within the last 10 years and the dairy is sitting right where he wants it to be.

Jon's current goal is to "just try to do a better job at what we do." They would like to stay at milking around the 220 cow range and continue to be more successful at it.

"We used to push the cows a lot harder [production-wise]. We used to get over 90 pounds of milk and our components were not as high," Schmit said. "Now we are averaging around 88 pounds [of milk] with a 4.25% fat and 3.45% protein, so our herd average has been climbing in the past few years due to the things we've done with different feed, breeding, and improved overall management."

Currently the herd is at 28,015 pounds of milk, 1,163 pounds of fat, and 952 pounds of protein. In the future, Jon would like to continue increasing pounds of milk, bettering his components, while also improving management on the farm.

BREEDER SPOTLIGHT – STEFFES REGISTERED HOLSTEINS



Steffes Registered Holsteins is a fifth-generation family farm located in Elizabeth, and the host of the 2023 Illinois Holstein Fall Picnic. The farm milks 420 cows and farms 450 acres of corn and 250 acres of alfalfa with all being used to provide feed for the dairy. Karen Steffes, Dennis and Jane Steffes and Austin and Darcy Ertmer strive to produce high-quality milk and provide the best care to the animals and the land.

Dennis' parents bought the farm in 1970. They started with ten cows, and the milk was carried to a can body given to them from the milk man. Since then, the farm has undergone several updates and expansions. A 38-cow stanchion barn was built in 1971. In 1978, the stanchion barn addition was built to grow the herd to 93 cows. This barn was updated to freestalls and houses bred heifers and dry cows today. In 1999, the parlor was built, and in 2003 the first three-row freestall barn was completed. In 2012, the four-row freestall barn was finished, and the new Lely robot facility started milking cows in January 2023.

The matriarch of the herd is Steffes Durham Cinnamon EX-91. She has more than thirty descendants in the herd today – from calves up to milk cows. Other homebred herd favorites include Steffes Jacoby Thunder Rolls EX-92, 94 MS; Steffes Corvette Finally EX-92; Steffes Novo Rocky EX-92; Steffes Dempsey Crimson Clover VG-89-3Y and Steffes Diamondback Shadow EX-91.

Other exciting cows include RJR-BH Goldwyn 1154-ET EX-95. She hails from an EX-93 full sister to Barbie. Her daughters include RJR Aftershock Destiny-ET EX-93 with descendants by Gold Chip, Unstopabull, Hancock, Warrior, Showtime, Select, Crush, Summerfest, Unix and Hanans. Also,

RJR Sid 3275-ET EX-90 with daughters by Diamondback and Hancock and Arethus GS Van Ireland-ET VG-86.

One Red and White Holstein of interest is Kara-Kesh-RK Sapphire-Red VG-87. She is an Armani from Plattvu Advent Sarah-Red EX-94 and is from the same family as Kara-Kesh-RK Jacot Selene – the 2022 Junior All-American Summer Junior 2-Year-Old.

When selecting bulls to use, the farm focuses on type, sound feet and legs, quality udders and strong milk production. The goal is to breed balanced cows that will stand the test of time. With the herd transitioning to robots, the linear for teat placement is also reviewed. Service sires include Showtime, Hancock, Handsome, Summerfest, Artist, Tatoo, Fitters Choice, Crushabull and Sidekick.

The Steffes family began planning for their most recent update as their existing facilities were overcrowded. The parlor was designed to handle 250 cows (and the family was milking 425 cows) with limited holding area space. In addition, milking three times a day in the parlor allowed only two hours down time. The family was at a cross-roads to build another freestall

barn and parlor or a robot facility. They decided to build a robot facility – not only for the comfort of the cows, but also for the labor benefit.



The barn is outfitted with four Lely robots. It is tunnel ventilated and has 240 stalls. The stalls are sand bedded once a week and automatic alley scrapers run every three hours. There is an auger at the end that transfers manure to the holding tank. There is also a bedded pen at the beginning of the barn that can be used for show cows or special needs cows.

When planning for their start-up, the Stef-



thrived – the cows adjusted well to flexibility of milking intervals that comes with robots and appreciated that the facility that fit their size, too.



From the first day, the Steffes family began observing the cow comfort benefits of the new facility for the entire herd. Cows had a stall to lie down in and became comfortable setting their own schedule to get milked in the robot. The automatic scrapers also keep the herd's feet cleaner, and the tunnel ventilation keeps fresh air moving – reducing the incidence of heat stress this summer.

fes family made several decisions they believed would ease the transition. Cows are fed gluten pellets in the robot as this was something the cows were already used to in their diet. The family felt introducing a new feed would have been difficult and might have resulted in reduced visits to the robot. The Steffes family also tried to keep cows that were in the same freestall group together to reduce the stress of regrouping in addition to the cows moving to a new milking facility and freestall barn.

The robotic milking facility began milking cows in January 2023. Overall, the Steffes family feels the cows transitioned very well. One of the biggest compliments they received during start-up was the cows are very friendly and easy to work. The family feels this contributed to the success they had during the first week of the transition. The first group they took to the robots was the bigger cows that didn't fit well in the parlor anymore and were the highest producers. The family saw these cows immediately

Trusting in automation and letting it do what it is designed to do can be challenging according to the Steffes family. However, there is a lot of information to help manage the herd and each cow. The family reviews data on rumination, activity, temperature, SCC and milk production. A fetch cow list and health report list are reviewed regularly throughout the day. Each family member also has access to the information on their cell phones.

The Steffes family is very happy with the results of the transition for the cows and the people working with the cows. They are looking forward to continuing to enjoy the new facility with their cows. For others looking at making a similar transition, they emphasize the importance of planning. They recommend looking at every option at several farms at different times of the year to understand how it will work on your farm. Also, work with people that know your existing management style. And, know your cows and understand how the transition will work for them.

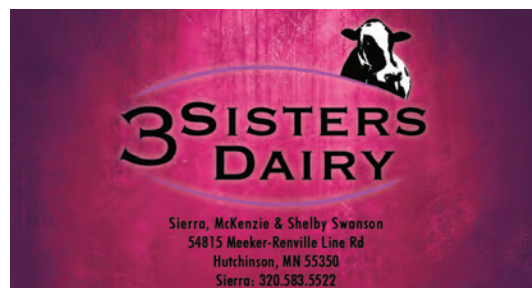

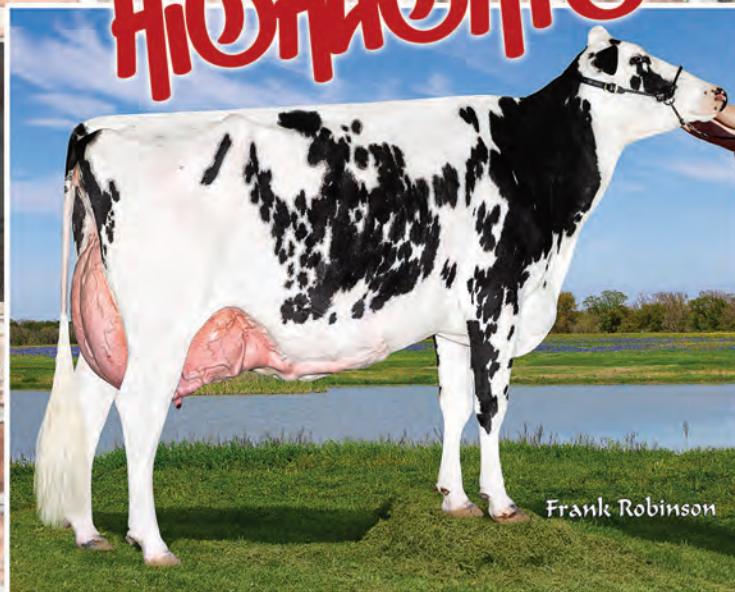

GOLDEN GOPHER FUTURITY XLVIV

- TWO-YEAR OLD FUTURITY -

The Golden Gopher Futurity is sponsored and governed by the Minnesota Holstein Association. Its purpose is to stimulate interest in breeding and developing outstanding Holsteins for type regardless of individual herd size. It is open to any Minnesota breeder of Holsteins identified through Holstein Association USA, Inc.

This will be a continuing program with the 2024 competition designated as Futurity No. XLVIV. One nomination is required for each animal that competes. New this year Competition will be in one category - type only. **The production futurity will no longer be continued.** Last applicants will be awarded in 2025. All nominations are the responsibility of the owner and must be made on regulation entry blanks, along with specified fees, postmarked by the nomination date and other rules. All money received from the nominations in the Futurity class shall make up the purse entered on the basis of their placings.

Any registered Holstein female, owned by a Minnesota Holstein Association member, and born from 9/01/22 through 8/31/23 is eligible for Golden Gopher Futurity XLVIV. One payment of \$25 shall be paid by 12/1/23.

A breeder may nominate any number of females in the type futurity. Nominations must be postmarked no later than the due date.

TYPE FUTURITY

Animals nominated will be shown in a special two-year old futurity class at the Minnesota State Show, winners and awards to be based on the placing at that show. Showing in this class does not eliminate her from showing in the All-Minnesota two-year old classes. All rules and regulations of the show are to be adhered to. Placings will be made by an official show judge. The purse shall consist of all money received by nomination fees, less the expenses for its promotion and management. All money will be kept in a special fund and used only for futurity purposes. Money received for Type nominations will be used only for those animals entered in that class. The money in this class will be divided among placings as follow:

First Place - 15 %; 2nd Place - 10%; 3rd Place - 8%; 4th Place - 6%; 5th Place 5%; 6-10 Placings - 4%; 11-15 Placings - 3%; 16-25 Placings - 2%. Remaining 1% to be used for administration fees.

If fewer than 25 animals are competing, the remainder will be divided equally among the entries.

All nomination fees are committed to the purse. No refunds will be made whether an animal completes or eligibility is discontinued.

Any animal sold after being nominated will remain eligible if the new owner is a Minnesota Holstein member.

The Minnesota Holstein Association is sponsoring and governing the futurity and will not be responsible for any accident or injury in connection with the show.

HOW TO ENTER:

- Look at your animals that were born between September 1st of the previous year through August 31st of the current year.
- Choose any animal that you believe has the potential of doing well in their class.

OBITUARY: CONRAD KVAMME

Conrad Kvamme, 88, of Arlington, MN, died Saturday, May 13, 2023.

Conrad Harlan Kvamme was born on August 2, 1934, in Crookston, MN, to Carl and Hilda (Natwick) Kvamme. Conrad grew up on his family farm in rural Twin Valley, taking an interest in caring for the farm at a young age. He attended country school, graduating early in 1950 from Twin Valley High School and later furthered his education at the North Dakota State University, majoring in agriculture education and animal science, with minors in ag journalism, speech, and horticulture. Following graduation, he started his career teaching at the Ulen High School for two years before working as a 4-H extension educator in Norman County. He then went on to teach at the University of Minnesota – Crookston for two years. Conrad married Karen Sivertson in 1958 and to this union, 5 children were born. While living on a dairy farm near Ada, MN, Conrad formed a singing duo with a neighbor named Howard Nuemann. They called themselves The Harmony Twins and traveled throughout a large area singing at various events, the highlight being invited to sing at the American Dairy Association convention in Chicago in 1961. Conrad purchased a farm near Little Falls, MN, and operated Orbit Dairy for over 20 years. In 1978, Conrad featured his cow, Memory, on national television and participated in Memory's March for Milk – a 32 day Promotion of Dairy Products Tour through 18 states, 47 US cities, and 146 presentations, touring from Canada to Mexico. In 1992, he sold his herd of cattle and began working with cattle nutrition and cattle sales management. A year later he moved to Arlington and was elected to the Minnesota Beef

Council as a member of the board of directors and later as the vice chairperson, positions he was very proud to serve on. Continuing his passion for the industry, Conrad took a position as a consultant on the Midwest Dairy Beef Quality Assurance Center, encouraging farmers to be certified in quality production techniques and proper animal care, especially with antibiotics and vaccinations. While working as a consultant, Conrad helped produce many brochures and information that was used in displays at the World Expo. He also operated a feed business named Space Age Dairy, selling quality feed. Conrad officially retired at the age of 80.

Known for being “one of the strongest voices in the Minnesota beef industry”, Conrad centered his life around his passion for cattle. He taught some grandchildren how to show cattle, one of his favorite pastimes. He was awarded with a plaque for 50 years of showing at the Minnesota State Fair. When he wasn't spending time with cattle, he continued to nurture his love of agriculture by planting gardens and tending to his lawn. Conrad will be greatly missed by his loved ones for his outgoing, friendly personality.

Conrad is survived by his children: Mark Kvamme of New Richman, MN, Kathy (Rick) Cochrane of Helena, MT, Sherry (Dave) Nelson of Hitterdal, MN, Lori (Rodney) Oberg and Lisa (Kim) Syverson, both of Ulen, MN; 19 grandchildren; 34 great-grandchildren; and other extended family members.

Conrad was preceded in death by his parents, Carl and Hilda Kvamme; two sisters, Senora and Bernice; brother, Art; and grandson, Jaycob.

Conrad Kvamme was passionate about helping the dairy industry succeed by promoting all things dairy. This includes creating his own milk product called “Mighty Milk” made in five unique flavors and readily sold to consumers. It was soon sold to several distributors across the United States. Conrad can be remembered for this and many more strides made within Minnesota's dairy community. His positive energy and drive will be missed by all!
