

TOUR FARM BIOS

WALK-ERA FARMS

Built on family and faith, Walk-Era Farms of Wisconsin Dells is truly where dreams of excellence are coming true. The Walker family has been located in the Wisconsin Dells area since Erwin and Ella Walker arrived from North Dakota in 1941. Walk-Era Farms consists of 850 acres with an additional 130 rented, for a total of 800 tillable acres. All cattle are raised on site under the care of the Walker families. Perhaps one of the most unique aspects of the farm is that all families involved today live within a three-mile radius of the barn. Walk-Era is a family corporation, including Dean and sons John, Tim, and Tom and their families. The Walk-Era herd has bred 175 Excellent cows to date. The quality of cattle in the herd today through years of selective breeding can be seen in their herd's 110.6 percent BAA, the herd is 96 percent homebred. Since 2016, the Walkers have been breeding the bottom end of their genetic Holstein herd to Wagyu and direct marketing farm fresh beef, they sell about 12-15 beef as 1/4s, halves and bundles each year. The crew at Walk-Era is excited to watch the fourth generation of Walkers become more active in the farm as the kids grow up. They are driven by passion, determination and, above all, love of farming and of family.

TRENT WAY GENETICS

Located in the rolling hills of southern Wisconsin, is Trent Way Genetics LLC. Just 12 years ago, starting as first-generation producers, Trent & Kelsey Henrickson journey began in December of 2011. Today the Hendrickson's and their young family run about 700 acres, milking around 300 dairy cows, raising all young stock of 450 heifers, along with 100 breeding bulls.

Our focus as a breeder is to breed the next generation of animals that can work in any facility or herd commercial, tie stall, or robotics. Through the use of extensive IVF and conventional flushing methods we have been able to achieve a high level of genetic advancement by using most of our milking herd and all our youngstock as recipients. Excellent cow families like the Roxy's helped us develop a lineup of red and white bulls like 250HO14465 Ronald RC, 7HO16303 Reward-Red, 7HO15427 Rompen-Red, and advanced us in achieving 12 of the top 25 red and white heifers in the breed (April 2023 proof)! Providing a new standard for the red and white and red carrier breed keeping the quality in breed leading health traits, outstanding high production while maintaining a balance type profile. Trying to focus on making every generation better and

continuing to breed the most balanced animal.

Jeffrey-Way Holsteins is owned and operated by Jeff, Kate, Brooks and Riley Hendrickson and Brooks and Riley's two children; Adlee and Callum. Jeffrey-Way Holsteins is home to 110 milk cows with a herd BAA of 113. The living herd includes one cow scored at Excellent-95, 10 cows scored at Excellent-94, 55 additional cows scored at excellent 90 or higher and 44 very good, giving the average classification score of 90.2. Currently the herd averages 88lbs a day with a 4.2 fat and 3.4 protein. We strive to breed functional type cows with great udders that will stand the test of time, make lots of milk and score high. The farm consists of 400 acres of land. We grow alfalfa, grass, corn and soybeans to supply the feed for the livestock. **LE-O-LA HOLSTEINS**

Le-O-La Holsteins is owned and operated by Rick and Kathy Demmer, a registered Holstein farm focusing on breeding high quality cattle backed by deep, proven pedigrees. They have a passion for excellent genetics and strive to create something that may spark interest in other dairymen across North America. To go along with this, they partake in embryo transfer and in-vitro fertilization to create a better animal to fit their program, generation after generation. They milk 75 cows twice a day in a tie-stall barn with a rolling herd average of 27,400 lbs of milk, 4.2% butterfat and 3.2% protein.

Taking pride in developing cows to their full potential and exhibiting them at a state and national level, Le-O-La Holsteins has received three All-American honors for their Senior Best Three Females. Three group and numerous All-American and Junior AllAmerican nominations and honors. Along with these show winnings, Rick and Kathy are proud to have bred one 95 Point Cow and have bred or developed twelve 94 Point Cows.

Most importantly, Rick and Kathy pride themselves on the family they have created. They have 7 children, Kayla, Kristy, Kyle, Riley, Rachel, Royce and Regan; their four sons all assist in different aspects of Le-O-La Holsteins, from genetics to day-to-day chores and more. Rick and Kathy now have nine grandchildren with one more on the way. They enjoy giving their grandchildren a bit of the farm life and watch them explore and enjoy the cows as much as they do.

FARNEAR HOLSTEINS

Farnear Holsteins is owned by Tom & Rick Simon, along with their sons, Adam and Mark.

Cows are housed in a robot barn consisting of 9 Lely robots built in 2021 for exceptional cow comfort. The Simon's are currently milking 540 cows in total. Current lactation average is 29,400 pounds, 1,257 pounds of fat, and 1,031 pounds of protein.

Farnear Holsteins was established in 1960. Tom and Rick breed their animals for a wide variety of traits to reach all markets within their genetic field. they have exhibited five homebred Grand Champions at the Iowa State Fair. Adler is now classified EX-96 and has been named Unanimous All-American Production Cow. Tom and Rick have sold more than 350 bulls that have been sold to numerous A.I. studs. Altitude-RED has sired numerous class winners at national shows across North America. Delta-Lambda was the Premier Sire at World Dairy Expo 2023. Farnear Holsteins also exhibited the Junior Champion of the Junior Show at World Dairy Expo in 2023. **MOONDALE HOLSTEINS**

Moondale Farm consists of 350 acres of corn, soybeans, and hay in the rolling hills of northeast Iowa. Currently their herd has 50 registered Holsteins milked in a tiestall barn twice a day. Their BAA is 112 with 26 EX, 25 VG, and 1 GP. At the Iowa State Show, Moondale has been named premier breeder 19 times. A large number of animals in the herd trace back to Moondale Leader Pat, EX 94 4E 40,690 5.3 2138.

HENKESEEN HOLSTEINS

Henkeseen Holsteins of Luana, IA is ran by Trent, Leslie, and Matt Henkes. They currently milk 65 registered Holsteins and 12 registered Milking Shorthorns with a DHIA herd average of 28080 3.8 1035 3.1 861 and Holstein BAA (10/2023) of 111.5 with 23 excellent cows, 22 very good cows, and 5 good plus cows. Their herd was the #1 BAA in Iowa 2022 and #5 Top BAA herd in region 6 2022. The Milking Shorthorn herd consists of 6 excellent cows, 3 very good cows, and 3 good plus cows. For 22 years they have been award winners of the Progressive Breeder Registry and Progressive Genetics Herd award winners for 18 years. Henkeseen has bred 180 excellents, 23 Dam of Merit winners and 21 Gold Medal Dams.

We focus on breeding for high type cows that translate to showing at local, district, state and national levels. Exciting young cows in the herd are sired by Jordy, Unstopabull, Delta Lambda and Moment to name a few. We're proud to behome to the 2X Unanimous All American Milking Shorthorn, Henkeseen Royalty Reason EXP EX 91. Reason is an 8 th generation homebred EX tracing back to Henkeseen M Hillary EX 94. Reason's daughters teamed up to place 2nd Junior Best 3 class at World Dairy Expo 2023.



THE SCHWEER FAMILY

A small dairy farm family, burrowed in Milbank, SD, takes extreme pride in carrying on the Don-Mil-Dale prefix and breeding exceptional high type registered Holsteins. The Schweer family consisting of Richard, Michelle, Kendra (22), Kaden (18), and Kayla (15) currently own and operate Don-Mil-Dale Holsteins where they are milking 37 cows, raising replacement heifers, and operating 240 acres of cropland. Richard's father, Donald, began milking cows in the barn the Schweer family is still milking in back in 1961. Since then, there have been several improvements to the barn and farmstead, but much of the same family artifacts still remain.

Family Remains at the Center

As a small family farm, the Schweer's have an intense amount of pride for their commitment to raising quality livestock together. When asked what their favorite part about dairy farming was, the family agreed that it was their ability to work together day to day and instill a passion for registered Holsteins in each other. Each family member has their own niche in what they enjoy doing around the farm, like many other farms. Richard and Michelle take charge of the feeding and milking, while the kids enjoy feeding calves, heifers, dry cows, and other various tasks that happen during chore time. Richard concluded that, "Dad has given my family and I an opportunity to dairy farm, and I want to continue doing just that for as long as we are capable."

Breeding Focal Point

The family has always bred for high type and has recently began breeding for higher components. "It feels good to milk good cows," says Richard, which is one of the many reasons they choose to continue to invest in registered Holstein programs. They also breed their cows to ensure they are able to sell eight to ten replacement heifers each year. Breeding is also catered

to the family's goal of maintaining a high BAA score. Twice a year the family works hard to get ready for classification and has a goal of raising four to five of their cows to excellent each classification. Breeding for high type and high components have allowed them to maximize profitability on their farm.

Claim To Fame

One of the most important and unique aspects of the farm is the legacy the Schweer's ancestors left behind. Don-Mil-Dale Holsteins was one of the first producer in the state of South Dakota to sell milk to Valley Queen in milk cans. They also were the first farm in South Dakota to perform embryo transfer back in 1982. From this, they had three heifer calves and two bulls calves. It is evident that this sparked their breeding patterns, which have carried into today. They continue to flush many of their best cows to keep growing their genetic potential.

The Schweer family embodies the true meaning behind family farming, and their love for registered Holsteins shines through their beautiful herd of cows.

THE GRATER GOOD

While they've become more "trendy" lately, cheese boards are nothing new. I swear that every dairy meeting or family event I've ever been to has included sliced cheese and meat, organized on a tray and well-loved by guests. So, if you're planning to serve a classic this holiday season, here's some tips and tricks from someone who sells those trendy charcuterie (shar-CU-ter-ee) boards.

Keep It Simple

My personal opinion is we've overcomplicated the cheeseboard. There was nothing wrong with those alternating lines of meats, cheeses and crackers, and if that's what you have time to prepare, that's perfect. However, if you feel like adding a little pizazz, I think I can help.

Work with the cheese

Pairing cheese is probably one of my favorite things because it requires some R&D. The best way to know if things taste good together, is to test them out yourself! The following are staples on my boards because of their versatility and ability to be a companion to so many: jam, honey, fresh and dried fruit, olives, pickles, mixed nuts, caramel, chocolates.

Personal favorite pairings include:

- Blue Cheese and Honey- trust me, it's good. The sweetness balances out the funk and you're left with the perfect salty sweet combo. I'm partial to a sheep milk blue called "Big Woods Blue" made locally in Nerstrand at Shepherds Way Farms.
- Garlic Cheddar and Dill Pickles- garlic and dill with the creaminess of the cheese to bring it home, Redhead Creamery's Garlic Cheddar is second to none in this category.

- Gouda and Jam- my favorite Gouda is made by Cannonbelles- it's creamy, it's salty, it's easygoing and fun just like the Belle's themselves and this combo is a crowd pleaser for ages 2-92.
- Goats milk cheese with Cinnamon and Cranberry- if you're near Kimball, MN and able to get your hands on some of my favorite plain chevre from Donnay Dairy, you can add the cinnamon and cranberries yourself. If you're looking for a premade version, the Humble Goat MN Goat's milk cheese is the GOAT.

Variety is the spice of life

When I'm putting together a board, I like to add a variety of flavors and textures so there's a little something for everyone. The general rule of thumb is a total of 2 oz cheese, 1 oz meat per person. This number can go up or down, depending on what else is being served at the time and how hungry your crowd is. When preparing a board for my family, I know that 2 oz total is not near enough, but I've brought boards to other functions and been surprised at how slowly the cheese board disappeared. As far as making it look "trendy", Pinterest or Instagram are full of awesome turtorials on how to slice and place cheese. From January 29 through February 1, King will visit six locations throughout Minnesota and South Dakota, sharing his wealth of knowledge acquired from his experiences as an influential dairyman. Meet Jeff King:

The King family breeds and manages a 2200 head registered Holstein herd, farming in Saratoga County, NY, and also operates an on-farm milk processing business. King Brothers Dairy is run by brothers Jeff and Jan King, the fourth generation to take the helm of the 120-year-old Kings-Ransom Farm, where they milk about 1000 head. Their grandfather and uncles bottled milk at the farm from the early 1900s until 1960. In 2016, a new creamery was built on the farm, followed by a retail space where they feature their milk and cream products and now make 90 flavors of ice cream. In addition to home delivery of fresh, glass bottled milk, they have their products in over 60 supermarkets in their area.

The Kings have an extensive breeding and genetic marketing program throughout the US and the world. Kings-Ransom MG Cleavage EX-95-USA (97 MS) completes 10 generations of Excellent Roxys and was credited with being a game-changer for the herd, opening the door to

many new relationships and genetic customers. Cleavage has an EX-95, 97 MS daughter among her many descendants. Another highly marketable and successful family for the Kings is Kings-Ransom Casp Daze EX-94-USA, the dam of Kings-Ransom Dropbox at Semex. Kings-Ransom Dynasty is a current headliner in the Blondin Sires lineup and hails from a second "D" family that the Kings have bred since the early 70's.

Also bred by the Kings, MS Kings-Rnsm Champ Haley EX-GMD-DOM went on to establish the Holler family at Cookiecutter Holsteins, from which descends the \$1.925 US million package selling S-S-I Doc Have Not 8784 EX-96-USA whom the Kings own in partnership.

Showing is important to the family, and they are regular exhibitors at local, regional and national shows. They are proud to have developed an All-American Produce and three nominated All-American Best 3 Female groups in recent years.


Doris loved to read, quilt, take photos, stay active swimming, and


When she wasn't in her sewing room or reading at her chair, Doris loved to travel, cook, and watch her grandchildren's activities.
