

### MEET YOUR MINNESOTA DJM APPLICANT:



My name is Thad Schlauderaff and I am the 20 year old son of Kelly and Jamaica Schlauderaff. I live in Frazee, Minn., and work full time at the heifer facility of my family's farm. We milk 650 holsteins 3 times per day in a double 12 parallel parlor. We farm about 2,200 acres of corn, alfalfa and soybeans and run a custom harvesting operation. We keep all of our bull calves and feed out steers until finishing. We ship steers by the semi load straight to the packing plant in Green Bay, Wisconsin. Currently, my siblings, cousins, and I are the fourth generation on the farm.

As a full time employee of the heifer operation, I do all of the feeding, breeding, and other daily activities that go with managing several hundred replacement heifers. I am also in charge of the bull selection for the entire herd along with doing all the matings on the animals I own personally. Currently, I am at the dairy every other weekend doing the herdsman's duties when he is off. Herdman duties consist of breeding any cows in heat, processing newborn calves, moving fresh cows or close cows, and any other things that need to be done. I have been a relief milker in the past if someone gets sick or we are short on help at that time. During the summer months, I am also involved with the harvest crew where needed and usually drive semi for haylage.

Despite coming from a commercial grade herd, the show ring is where my heart truly lies. I have been showing grade calves at the county level since a very young age and my first time showing outside of 4-H was the Minnesota State Holstein show the summer after I graduated high school. Since then, I have made huge strides in the show industry, and I have helped the youth in my county accelerate their own showing careers and skills. I also walked the colored shavings for the first time in fall 2023, just two seasons after my first state show which is an accomplishment I am very proud of.

There are a few key opportunities granted by 4-H that have had an unspeakable impact on my dairy career. The single greatest opportunity, and one that I believe changed the trajectory of my life, was the chance to represent Minnesota at the National Dairy Conference in Madison, Wis. during World Dairy Expo. That was my first time going to WDE, and I knew after that it would be my goal to one day exhibit cattle there. The people I met on that trip are friends I still have to this day and I believe they are another huge reason why I got so involved with the Minnesota Holstein Association (MHA) and the activities that go with it. Many of the friends I made on this trip were, at the time, members of the MN Junior Holstein Association (MJHA) Board of Directors, and that inspired me to get involved much more than ever before.

I became a member of the MJHA when I purchased my first calf in 8th grade, but my involvement was really stagnant until my trip to Madison in the

fall of 2019. The spring of 2020 came and effectively put an end to any idea of a normal year of shows and other statewide junior activities. My first state junior convention was the first one hosted after covid and was held almost a whole year after I graduated high school. I drug along my sisters and one of my cousins; we were the only kids from my part of the state. I ran for the state junior board but was unsuccessful due to how new I was and a lack of people knowing me.

In the summer of 2022, MHA state show ended up being hosted 15 minutes from my house. I, along with my mom's side of the family, brought a string of about 8 heifers. Much of our string did not belong there, and it was overall a relatively disappointing week for placings. Although, it did have some upsides. A heifer I purchased that spring with my sisters ended up being HM All MN fall yearling. I was given a lot of pointers on my fitting by Adam Johnson from Lida-Acres Holsteins, and to this day, Adam is one of my biggest mentors and the reason I have had some fitting success. Later that summer, I exhibited my fall yearling at my first national show and had the opportunity to tie in and help the Johnson family for the week.

In fall 2022, I had my first experience of barn life at World Dairy Expo thanks to a referral from my friend Jacob Schaefer. I was given the chance to be on the Maple-Leigh Futures crew working nightline for Tanner Schmaling. I was their nightline, and I was involved with both morning and night chores. It was a great learning experience to see how a very successful string operates. While I was there, I was determined to add more genetics to my herd as I am always looking for new bloodlines and what better place than the biggest show in the world. I spent my time that I wasn't working or sleeping to walk around the barns looking for a heifer to purchase privately. On the last day of the show, with the help of Nate Donnay, another mentor and influence on my junior career, I had finally found one. MS Doc Hi-light was a King Doc spring yearling who ended up third place spring yearling in the International Jr Holstein show, and she was due the next March to sexed Tatoo. While the sale fell through during WDE, that was not the end of my story with that heifer.

March 2023 rolled around, and I was very excited for my second junior convention and another chance to get on the junior holstein board. That year, I brought more involvement from my area and we had nine total youth from my holstein club attend the convention. I decided to become more outgoing this year, and because I had been at state show, Midwest Fall National and WDE, a larger group of kids knew who I was, so I was pretty optimistic about my chances. Sure enough, the annual meeting came, and it was time to vote. I ended up getting the last spot on the board, and am currently the All-Breeds Liaison and chair of the State Show committee.

This past summer ended up being my most successful one yet in the show ring. Shortly after state show in June, I privately purchased Ms Doc Hi-light as a junior two year old, and she scored VG 87 shortly afterwards. At the Midwest Fall National show, I once again tied with the Johnson family and Hi-light won her class and was pulled out for Intermediate Champion of the junior show. At World Dairy Expo, I exhibited her along with a spring yearling that was second junior at Midwest Fall National. I was very thankful to have tied with the Griffin family of Kara-Kesh Holsteins who have had much success in the International Red and White show in years past. Hi-Light ended the week standing in tenth place in the International Jr Holstein Show. While at WDE, I did all my own fitting, and although it was not the best fitting job that week, I am still proud of how far I've come as a fitter and hope to continue to improve.

It was a big summer in the show ring, and I also started doing embryo work and flushes on several of my animals. In late May 2024, I flushed Xcaret Goldwyn Aubrey to sexed Sidekick, and am looking forward to getting those calves in a little over a month. Shortly before the state fair, I sent Hi-light down to ivf, but due to a lab mishap, she only made one embryo from 29 oocytes. Luckily, a guy that works for the local coop had some frozen embryos, and my setup recipients did not go to waste. I am now expecting multiple Goldwyn pregnancies this June. Due to the mishap in the lab, I was credited with another session. I flushed her again before expo and got 10 Delta Lambda embryos that I froze. I have implanted several of those, and I am expecting several September Delta Lambda calves.

I am now coming to the end of my junior board term, am looking forward to my last MJHA convention and attending the state All Breeds Convention as a junior representative. I am using my connections from across the state to help lineup tours for the junior convention and get donations for our junior benefit auction. With my term coming to an end, I will be doing less preparing for the state show. I am still tasked with selecting a judge for the junior state show and will use the connections I made through my junior career. Due to our prior relationship, I was able to ask Tanner Schmaling as an up and coming judge to



judge the 2024 Minnesota State Junior Holstein Association show. Although I am a bit disappointed that my time with MJHA is coming to an end, I enjoyed it and learned a lot. I look forward to what comes next for me and my holstein leadership career.

This is my last year as a junior, and I have big goals in the show ring. Hi-light and Aubrey are both due back for this spring, and I have a winter senior 2-year-old whose pedigree goes back to KHW Regiment Apple. She is recently fresh and looking great. I would like to get Hi-light back to the International Jr. Holstein Show and push for a Jr. All American nomination this year. I have goals of exhibiting a heifer and competing in the junior fitting and showmanship contest at World Dairy Expo in 2024. I also plan on exhibiting my first home bred heifer at a national show this season.

I recently started doing all of the bull selections for our grade herd and am very excited to see what I can do with that in the next few years. I am also in the process of enrolling the herd into Holstein USA's Basic ID program with hopes to move the herd toward a registered herd. I would like to start implementing some genomic testing on some of our better genetic lines to do more flushing and embryo transfers to accelerate overall genetic improvement. In my personal career, I plan on building a facility in the next year for some of my high type animals as I have multiple embryo calves coming with more flushes planned. Currently, I do not have a great spot to keep my show cows and running them with our other cows is not conducive to achieving the goals I set for myself in the show ring. I plan to begin marketing some of my genetics in the next year once I have an established flush program and enough offspring out of my foundation cows.

While I have had a brief Junior Holstein career, it has been highlighted by huge strides in many areas such as my work life, leadership career, and passion in the show ring. The opportunities and experiences granted to me through Junior Holstein have instilled in me an even deeper love for the Holstein cow. This passion is going to help me thrive in my career on my home farm. I plan to use my junior holstein board experiences to continue to advance my leadership roles within my local Holstein group and increase junior involvement in my part of the state. I am most excited to use my new connections and love of the show ring to continue to chase my goals of breeding and developing great cattle.





### MEET YOUR MINNESOTA YDJM APPLICANT:



Have you heard of the poem, "Not Just A Cow?" I think most people in the dairy industry have met or owned a cow that makes this poem come to life for them. My cow Fireball, has been that cow for me and today I will go over our story and how she's played an important part in my junior holstein journey.

It starts off three years ago, in the spring of 2021. I was trying to help my mom pick out a few bulls to breed one of my favorite cows to (but the cows are all my favorite in a way). Firefly descends from 21 generations of very good or excellent scored cows which proves the family transmits well. For my family's goals, it's important a cow family breeds true. We ended up picking Solomon because we thought he would help fix her front end.

Fast forward to 2021 "Great Minnesota Get Together" AKA the Minnesota State Fair, for dairy open class that week. My family puts together a string of animals from our farm and a few friends' tie ins. There was one heifer that caught my eye who was owned by one of our friends. She was all white, we normally just had mostly black calves. Time, this white calf, was super sweet and kind of tricky to keep clean but had great topline hair. Since I like a challenge, I enjoyed keeping her clean and by the end of state fair, I asked my mom if we could get a white show calf for me to show next year. My mom reminded me a lot of Solomon calves can be white, so that maybe Firefly's calf could be a good candidate. She was due right around December, so the timing would be perfect.

It felt like I waited for forever, but on December 1st, 2021 while I was in art class, I opened a snapchat my mom sent me. I could hardly contain myself. The snap was of a little white calf and my little brother. I finally got my white calf. I was so happy! We like to have fun naming our calves and Firefly's all of family members have the word "fire" in their name so I decided to name her Fireball. Since I feed the baby calves, I got to spend a lot of time with Fireball that winter. Whenever I finished my chores early or was having a bad day, you could find me with Fireball. We would listen to music in her calf hutch. With it being such a long winter once Fireball was weaned, she got to come in a box stall in the barn. It was nice having her in the barn. I was able to start breaking her to lead and work with her every day. In late April 2022, we took Fireball and a few other heifers to the Wisconsin Spring Showcase. It was a fun experience and I got to meet a lot of new people in the industry.

When we got home, I made it my mission to work on showmanship. We started to work on it just about everyday. In June, we went to Perham, Minn. for the Holstein State Show. The winter calf class was tough and it was pretty cool to stand third, HM Jr. All-MN. This gave

me the confidence to try other things while at state show. I participated in the Ag Olympics, a fitting clinic and attended the dance, where I met some new friends. Using this prefix, Kevin has bred and developed over 50 Excellent cows including nine EX-92 point cows and over 250 very good cows. He was named Outstanding Junior Breeder in 2004.

Kevin has been an active member of the agriculture and dairy industry. He has served on the Illinois Holstein Association board of directors and as President from 2011-2013. Kevin also puts his judging and reasons skills to good use by judging numerous Illinois county fair open and 4-H shows. He enjoys helping the next generation find their passion with cattle by volunteering with Altamont FFA's dairy judging team. Our 2023 Service Award winner is Steve Kollmann. Steve has been a member





#### IMPORTANT RULES TO REVIEW

(A full list of rules can be found online at www.mnholstein.com)

- 1. State show entry fee is \$20. Entries can be completed on FairEntry.com.
- 2. There will be no reserved stall fee and cattle will be stalled upon arrival.
- 3. State show entries must be received by May 21, 2024. Entries received after the May 21, 2024 deadline will be assessed a \$50 per animal fee. Entries received after June 10, 2024 will be \$100. Substitutions will be permitted.
- 4. All identification papers must be presented and identified in the exhibitor's name, except papers presented with a signed transfer and fees attached. Transfers and fees will be collected and sent to the Holstein Association USA. No calls will be made to verify ownership. Animals that are going on to other shows will be verified with Holstein Association USA. If these transfers are not recorded there within 90 days of our state show, the exhibitor(s) will be ineligible to show at a Minnesota Holstein sponsored district or state show for the following calendar year.
- 5. Copies of identification certificates will not be accepted. Original and association duplicates of identification certificates are permitted and accepted. Email copies of both sides of the identification papers from the Holstein Association USA will be accepted for show. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide the email. Any %RHA is eligible to show.
- **6.** Syndicate or partnership animals may be shown at the Minnesota district and state shows providing the following requirements are met: 1. Show proof of ownership with a list of all members from Holstein Association USA, if all members are not individually listed on identification certificate. 2. Entry fee paid by exhibitor. 3. Paid state membership by each partner.
- 7. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, and everyone is using the same prefix, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder.
- 8. As exhibitor of all dairy animals originating from my farm to be exhibited at the Minnesota State Holstein Show agree that said animals have been vaccinated with either a killed or modified-live vaccine for the following diseases: IBR, BVD and Lepto within six months of the show date. If any outbreak should occur and is linked to our originating farm, Minnesota Holstein Association will not be liable.
- **9.** The best udder in each milking class will be recognized with a rosette ribbon at the state **show.**
- 10. Exhibitors who wish to be recognized for production must identify accordingly in FairEntry.com and provide a DHIA herd code and barn ID. From there the records will be officially verified by DHIA. Any records sent in after the entry deadline will not be eligible for receiving production recognition.
- 11. There are no dry cow classes.
- 12. Premier Breeders (Bred and Owned) the owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. Please Note: For non-family partnerships, to qualify for Bred & Owned Awards, one of the original owners must be listed as one of the current owners.
- 13. Exhibitors at any MN Holstein district or state show must live in Minnesota or South Dakota
- 14. Any animal exhibited at any MN Holstein district or state show must be shown in only one state.
- 15. Premier exhibitor and premier breeder points will be based on six animals. Exhibitor must be the owner. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, and everyone is using the same prefix, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder. However, where the ownership is from two or more herds they will be considered as separate entries as stated owners on the paper with one owner having to be a resident of the state of Minnesota and a member of Minnesota Holstein Association. Senior points, starting at 20 with a 2-point drop between each placing down to 10th place, will be awarded for milking cow classes. Junior points will be awarded to the junior animals and will start at 10 points with a 1- point drop between each place down to 10th place.

# JUNIOR RULES AND REGULATIONS

The show will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, June 14, 2024.

All entries must be in place and checked in 24 hours prior to the show.

1. Exhibitors must be a minimum of nine years old to participate, but not have reached their 21st birthday by January 1 in the year competing. Members who become 21 years of age during the current year will be allowed to compete in Junior activities until December 31st of the current year and not beyond that time.

- 2. All junior members will show under Minnesota Junior Holstein Association rules and animals must be shown by the owner except in extreme situations and then approved by the junior show committee a week prior to the show. Alternate leadsman forms can be requested if needed.
- 3. Any animal shown at the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show with the exhibitor's name listed by May 15, 2024 qualify to be shown. If you wish to show an animal with the immediate family's prefix the registration paper does not need the exhibitors name on it (immediate family means parents and children). Adult/Junior partnerships are permitted. \*This rule only applies for the MN Jr. State Show.
- 4. **4-H Lease Acceptance** the Minnesota Junior Holstein Association will be accepting 4-H leases for the MJHA State Show. To enter a leased animal, you need to submit a copy of the registration paper and a copy of your lease affidavit on FairEntry.
- 5. State show entries must be received by May 21, 2024. Substitutions will be permitted. All entries must be completed on FairEntry.com.
- 6. The MN Junior State Show will start at 8:00 a.m. on June 14. The first class will be Class 22-J (Novice Calf), then Class 10-J through 18-J, then Class 1-J through 7-J ending with Class 23-J through 25-J.
- 7. Novice Class: Novice Calves may be from class 1-J, 2-J and 3-J. The calf may be shown in another class but the novice show person may not show in another class. Please remember to keep the size of the calf appropriate for the youth's ability. Ownership rules do not apply to novice class show person. The animals will NOT be placed and all youth will receive the same award.
- 8. All junior exhibitors are subject to the PDCA Code of Conduct Rules.

#### **ENTRY FEE**

Entry fee for the Minnesota Junior Holstein Show is \$10 per head. If you would like to participate in both the open and junior show, both fees need to paid, and you need to register your animal as such in Fairentry.com. The fee is per head therefore you do not need to pay \$10 for a novice calf if the calf is already being exhibited in a different class. Only one animal per class will be cataloged. Substitutes can be made at the show.

#### JUNIOR BRED AND OWNED

Junior Bred and Owned Class is based off the National Rules. To be eligible for Junior Bred & Owned, at least one of the Junior owners must be listed as a breeder and owner on the registration certificate.

#### **TRANSFERS**

A reminder to all juniors to get your junior state show animals transferred or registered now. Animals shown in the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show must be transferred into the exhibitor's name by May 15, 2024.

- If papers are late coming, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to call

Holstein Association USA so they have the papers in hand on the day of the show.

- There will be absolutely no transfer or registration applications accepted for junior show animals and there will be no phone calls or other such inquiries made to Holstein Association USA on junior animals.

#### ACCEPTABLE IDENTIFICATION

All animals exhibted in the Minnesota State Junior Holstein Show must have two verified forms of identification at check-in. This could include: Holstein USA tags, registered RFID tag, drawing, or photo on registration paper.

# AUTUMNWOOD FARM

# The Daninger Family

Caring for land, animals, and people, Autumnwood Farm is a local dairy farm and creamery providing "Milk from Grass to Glass." While the creamery began bottling milk in 2008, the current farmstead has been in the Daninger Family since 1902.

Pat Daninger is the third generation to farm on the land of Autumnwood Farm in Forest Lake, MN. Along with his wife, Sharlene, they raised and worked with their four children, Luke, Erin, Nathan, and Mariah on this same land. Now grown, Luke is active in managing the land and crops on the farm while Mariah's main responsibility is managing the milking herd.

The Daningers have 125 Registered Holstein cows. In 2018, the Daningers retrofitted their 40-stall tie-stall milking barn to a double-8 parallel parlor and built a freestall housing barn. The cows at Autumnwood Farm have access to pasture as weather allows. Pat began buying a few Registered Holsteins in college to add to his parent's grade Holstein herd and when Pat & Sharlene took over the farm in 1989, they began registering all animals.

Looking for a way to provide opportunities for future generations, Pat & Sharlene Daninger decided on a micro-creamery. In 2007, they broke ground and milk hit the glass bottle the following year. Now 15 years in, there have been many lessons learned the hard way and challenges overcome. Autumnwood Farm services milk, half & half, and cream to more than 100

grocery stores, coffee shops, and cafes in the metro area in addition to a store right on the farm. Skim, 1%, whole, non-homogenized whole "creamline", chocolate, half & half, and cream make up the consistent line of products, with seasonal flavors such as eggnog, strawberry, orange cream, and root beer float making appearance throughout the year. In addition to milk, they now make ice cream base mix for six ice cream shops who use the mix to develop their own unique flavors.

Glass bottles allow the milk to stand out on the store shelves which serves a great purpose in providing interest toward reminiscing on the "olden days" for many customers, but the glass also allows the milk to taste like pure milk while staying cold longer. The bottles are returnable, with a \$2.00 deposit with each purchase. Customers an enjoy their milk, wash the bottle, and return to any store selling Autumnwood Farm milk

A fantastic creamery team devotes intentionality and commitment to an excellent milk product through their work. Third and fourth generation Daninger family members care for the dairy cattle and land with the goal of creating a farm, business, and livelihood that provides opportunities for future generations and all who are a part of the Autumnwood Farm team to be successful.



# 2024 MINNESOTA PDCA DISTINGUISHED BREEDER You and Ann Larson

The Larson family of Albert Lea, MN, own and operate Larcrest Holsteins. Jon and Ann Larson, along with their son Tyler who attends the University of Northern Iowa, and nephew Chase Sexton have built a lasting legacy in the dairy industry. Holsteins, Milking Shorthorns, and Jerseys became the foundation of their herd with a recent DHIA herd average of 25,198 M, 1,107 F, and 861 P. The family also owns 500 acres of land and rent an additional 100 acres to be used for growing corn and alfalfa to feed their herd. Larcrest Holsteins is home to 250 milking cows with 400 head of young stock. The entire Larson family and team at Larcrest Holsteins are involved in many activities throughout breed organizations and within their community. One of the farm's most notable feats is their success in embryo merchandising throughout the world. In 2013, Larcrest Cardigan sold on the Party at the Park sale as lot 1 for \$400,000. Mark Kerndt sold Larcrest Canto as lot 2 for \$290,000. Larcrest Crayon sold as lot 3 for \$200,000. Jon Larson concludes that "one of the most rewarding aspects of our merchandising program has truly been the people we have met. I never would have dreamt that we would have hosted people from around the world that we now consider friends. It has been absolutely unforgettable."

The Larcrest prefix has made a large footprint in the registered Holstein realm as they continue to make strides within the herd. Larcrest Holsteins was recognized as one of the twelve most influential Holsteins Breeders of the World within the past 25 years by Holstein International in 2019. This goes with giving credit to to Larcrest Cosmopolitan family who was named one of the top eight most influential cow family within the past 25 year by Holstein International in 2020. Additionally, they have sent over 100 bulls to A.I. Larcrest Cosmopolitan was the #1 TPI cow of the breed in 2008. Then, in 2015 Larcrest Comical EX 91 94 MAM made her was to #1 Net Merit cow of the breed and Larcrest Cordial EX 92 was #1 Type cow of the breed. Larcrest Crimson was named the 2016 Global Cow of the Year by Holstein International. In 2017, Larcrest Commander soared to #1 LPI bull in Canada and top 10 TPI bull in the U.S. Larcrest Cale's Mogul son, Green Heights Cosmopolis, made his way to #1 proven bull in Japan in 2018. These accomplishments and more have helped Larcrest Holsteins become a staple in the industry.

The "C" family at Larcrest is certainly one the Larson's are proud to have bred and marketed throughout the world. Cosmopolitan is the foundation of this extraordinary cow family, and did this by capturing the #1 GTPI spot in the U.S. and producing offspring that followed directly in her footsteps. Larcrest Cripmson EX-94 was the highest scoring Ramos daughter and is the grand dam to Larcrest Commander. Crimson's lifetime totals include a 96 point mammary system, 372,038 M, 15,915 F, and 13,180 P. There are a multitude of other accomplishments that the Larcrest "C" family has achieved, which has made this farm become well-known in the Holstein industry throughout the world! Jon and Ann Larson are extremely active in many organizations throughout their local communities and within the dairy industry. Oftentimes they can be found promoting youth dairy programs in their area. Jon coaches the Freeborn County 4-H dairy quiz bowl and 4-H dairy judging teams. Jon was the coach of a Minnesota 4-H Dairy Judging team who qualified to compete in Louisville. Throughout the summer he enjoys judging dairy shows each year. For six years, Jon has served the Freeborn County Holstein Association as the President. Ann and Jon have been involved with the Bearlake Lutheran Church Council for six years and the Freeborn County ADA for eight years. For nearly 20 years, Jon, has been the President of the Freeborn-Waseca-Faribault-Martin County DHIA Association. In 2019, the family was inducted into the Freeborn County Agriculture Hall of Fame and was named the Freeborn County Farm Family of the Year in 2021.
